

Extension Sets Meetings For Local Dairymen

Milk producers in Pennsylvania will be mailed a ballot regarding the Milk Marketing Development Program on December 3 according to M. M. Smith, County Agent and Victor Plastow, Associate County Agent. In a letter to all milk producers in Lancaster County this week, the agents said, "This referendum will give all producers a chance to vote on the proposed plan to deduct one-half of one percent (50%) from their gross milk check. Less hauling funds are to be used to promote the sale of milk.

"Our Extension Service is cooperating with our local Milk Marketing Committee and the State Department of Agriculture by scheduling four (4) educational meetings to discuss the

Area School Board. Member of Lancaster Production Credit Association and a Director of Federal Land Bank Association.


