CATTLE — Compared with last weeks close Slaughter Steers 25 50 higher with the full advance on average Choice and below Slaughter Heifers fully 50 higher Cows 50-1 00 higher and Bulls 50 higher. Receipts 74 percent Slaughter steers, 23 percent Heifers with the balance mostly Cows. Overall finish of Slaughter Steers not much changed from last week with 13 percent Prime and 80 percent Choice compared with 12 percent Prime and 80 percent Choice last week and 10 percent Prime and 77 percent Choice a year ago. Average cost and weight of Slaughter Steers estimated at 28.55 and 1160 lbs as compared with 28.64 and 1159 lbs last week and 28.42 and 1143 lbs a year ago. Heifer supply mostly High Good to Prime weighing 825-1050 lbs.
