trip, I spend considerable time planning, deciding what type of picture could be taken and might be useful. But also, working on speculation requires the flexibil-

ity necessary to follow up interesting subjects as they accidentally arise. On a recent trip to Texas, for example, I was photographing a famous herd of Mohai goats when I learned that the daughter of the family which owned the goats was a well-known equestrienne. I spent a pleasant and profitable afternoon photographing the daughter and her "quarter" horse for my files in addition to the goats. This is one of the exciting challenges of working on speculation. Just around the next corner may be the finest picture you will ever shoot," he said.

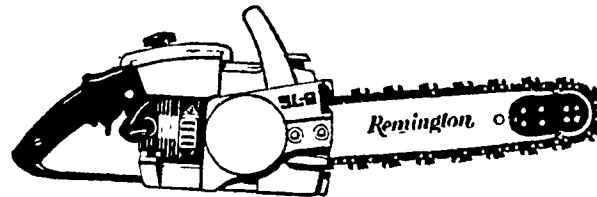

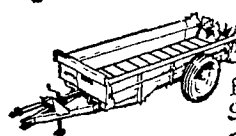
