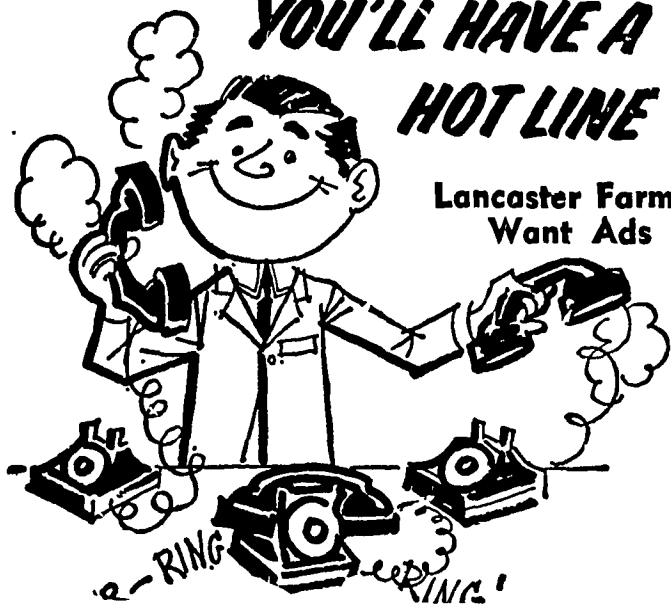

**Broiler Placement Up 30%**  
Placements of broiler chicks in the Commonwealth during the week ending November 15 were 1,194,000. The placements were 30% above the same week a year earlier and 13% above the previous week. Average placements during the past 10 weeks were 17% above a year earlier. Settings for broiler chicks were 1,802,000 — 5% above the previous week and 13% above the comparable period a year earlier. The current 3-week total of eggs set is 10% above the same period a year ago. Inshipments of broiler-type chicks during the past 10 weeks averaged 5,000 and compares with 14,000 a year ago. Outshipments averaged 305,000 during the past 10 weeks, 23% above a year earlier.

**22 STATES:** Placements in the 22 States were 55,957,000 — 3% above the previous week and 13% above the same week a year earlier. Average placements during the past 10 weeks were 12% above a year ago Settings

**Random Shooting Unlawful During Big Game Season**  
Sportsmen are reminded that they may not shoot at random during the big game seasons starting on Friday, November 28.

It is unlawful, during big game seasons, to shoot at any mark or target other than legal birds or animals, except at a properly constructed target or a dead tree within 200 yards of the hunting camp or headquarters of the shooter.

Hunters are warned that it is unlawful to fire at public utility poles, transformers, insulators, traffic signs, warning posters, etc.

**Apple Holdings Reflect Early Harvest**

The 258,500,000 pounds of apples in Pennsylvania cold storages on October 31 is above recent years, reflecting an early completion of harvest. This 258,500,000 pounds converts to 6,155,000 boxes of 42 pounds each. York apples account for two-fifths of all the apples now in storage.

The 1969 apple crop is estimated at 510 million pounds or 12,143,000 — 42 pound equivalents, the largest since 1964.

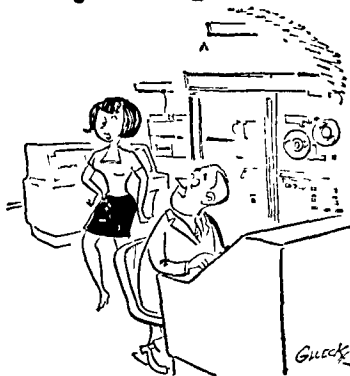

**Gasoline Is Powerful**

When one handles gasoline carelessly, such as overfilling a tank, adding fuel while a tractor is running hot or spilling fuel, the chances of a dangerous fire or explosion are greatly increased. Handle all fuels, and especially gasoline, as carefully as you would dynamite, cautions Extension agricultural engineers at The Pennsylvania State University.
