Producers continue to hold for further production in many quarters in view of current high egg prices. Heavy hens limited and short of a good buying interest. Turkeys fully adequate for a fairly good demand with occasional sales noted at 27-28c on young hens and 22-23c on young toms. Prices paid at farm: Light type hens: 8-1½ M 11¼-11½c in Pennsylvania, mostly 10-10½c in New Jersey. Heavy type hens: Fewer.

# Farm Vacations Booklet Now Being Compiled

The State Department of Agriculture is now compiling the 1970 issue of the "Pennsylvania Farm Vacation Directory." Farmers who have facilities for paying guests can turn them into a profitable enterprise by taking advantage of the promotional services of the Department. All previous registrants who have offered accommodations are being contacted for renewals of their listings, but with farm vacationing now an integral part of Pennsylvania's tourist industry, the Department is seeking additional registrants.

More than 100 farms from all regions of the state were listed for the 1969 season when 25,000 copies of the directory were distributed. The Department noted that the greatest number of requests came from the large urban areas of the states of New York and New Jersey.

Farmers may obtain the necessary forms for listing in the 1970 directory by writing to the Bureau of Markets, Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, 2301 N. Cameron St., Harrisburg 17120. Closing date for entries is January 15, with distribution of the directory set for March of next year.
