OATMEAL BISHOP'S BREAD

- 1 cup milk
- 1 tablespoon vinegar
- 1 cup sifted all-purpose flour
- ½ cup sugar
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon soda
- 1 cup rolled oats, quick or old-fashioned, uncooked
- ½ cup semi sweet chocolate pieces
- 1 cup golden raisins
- ¾ cup chopped candied cherries
- ¾ cup chopped almonds
- ¼ cup vegetable oil

- 1 egg, beaten
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

Grease and wax paper line an 8½ x 4½ x 2½-inch loaf pan. Combine milk and vinegar; set aside. Sift together flour, sugar, salt and soda. Add oats, chocolate pieces, raisins, cherries and almonds, stirring to coat evenly with dry ingredients. Add milk-vinegar mixture, oil, egg and vanilla; stir only until dry ingredients are moistened. Pour batter into prepared loaf pan. Bake in preheated slow oven (325 degrees) 60 to 65 minutes or until cake tester inserted in center of loaf comes out clean. Cool on wire rack about 10 minutes. Remove from pan; peel off

waxed paper; cool thoroughly. Wrap bread and store one day before slicing. Makes 1 loaf.

FESTIVE FILBERT LOAF

- Loaf Cake:**
- 2 cups pancake mix
 - ¾ cup granulated sugar
 - ¾ cup grated German sweet chocolate
 - ¾ cup grated filberts
 - 1¼ cups milk
 - 2 eggs, beaten
 - 3 tablespoons butter or margarine, melted
 - 1 teaspoon vanilla

- Frosting:**
- ¾ cup butter or margarine
 - 2 tablespoons milk
 - 1 package (1 ounce) no-melt unsweetened chocolate

- 1 ½ to 1¾ cups sifted confectioners sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

For loaf cake, combine pancake mix, sugar, chocolate and filberts in bowl. Add milk, eggs, butter and vanilla, stirring lightly until moistened. Pour into greased 9x5x3 inch loaf pan. Bake in moderate oven (350

degrees) about 50 to 55 minutes. Cool about 10 minutes. Remove from pan; cool thoroughly on wire rack.

For frosting, beat butter and milk together; add chocolate. Slowly add sugar and beat until shiny and of spreading consistency; add vanilla. Frost sides and top of completely cooled cake. Makes 1 loaf cake.



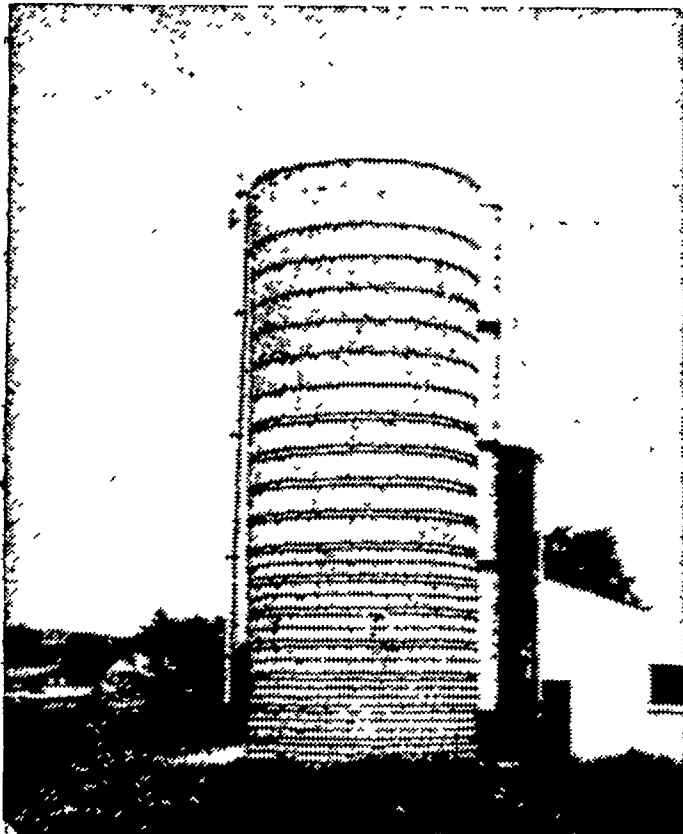

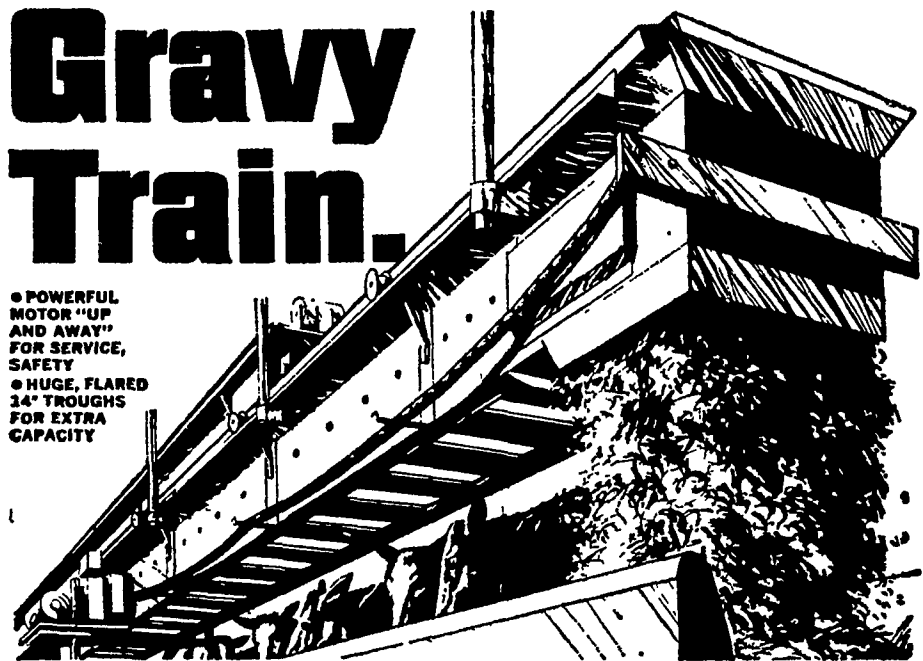
