The next meeting of the Society will be held on Dec. 27 at Evans Restaurant in Manheim when husbands and guests will attend a holiday banquet.

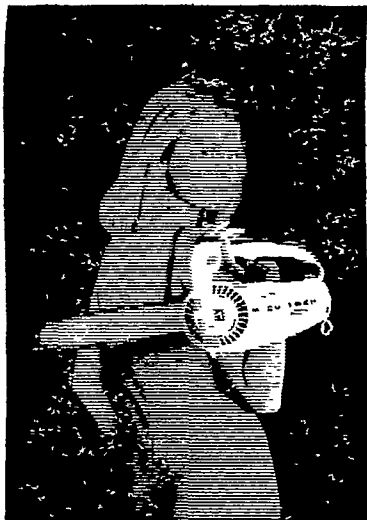
**SOCIETY 28**

**How To Redecorate Inexpensively**

Redecorating doesn't have to be expensive. The less you have to spend, the more you need to rely on color. Try to decide on a unified color scheme throughout your house before you start redecorating. This can help your home appear larger. And you can economically interchange draperies and rugs.

Select colors you and your family like. The furnishings you now have can determine the colors you choose. A miscellaneous set of furnishings can often be pulled together by a related color scheme.

You need to consider the limitations of the setting of your house. Rooms that face south and west get more heat and light than do those facing east or north. Perhaps you want to use cool colors in south and west rooms, warm colors in east and north rooms.

There's another economical feature to color choice Colors that don't fade or fade gracefully mean fewer paint jobs. Nature's colors — greens, blues, and browns and their hues — not only reduce daily and weekly care but they stay good-looking longer than do most clear, sharp colors

Remember color can help you achieve a new look in decoration, economically.

**Today's Fabrics Are Easier To Care For**

Long on wear and short on care are today's specially treated fabrics for fashions and home furnishings.

"New finishes — some invisible — are being applied to textiles, yarns and completed garments to improve appearance and performance," points out home economist Iola H Mathias, University of Maryland Extension Service.

Read the labels and handtags carefully, the clothing and textiles specialist advises shoppers. Machine-washing in soap or detergent suds, machine drying, and little or no ironing is all the care required by a wide range of merchandise — from durable press tablecloths to wool fashions to stain resistant and soil releasing apparel, she adds.

Some of the more recently used finishes are described below:

**AQUETTE** — adds durable press and machine-washability features to wool and wool-blend fabrics, which can be tumble-dried after laundering and worn without ironing.

**BANCARE** — resists dirt, stains, rust, perspiration, bacterial damage, and mildew; adds a "wrinkle recovery" to wet or dry fabrics; and needs no ironing after laundering. This finish is available on home furnishings and apparel including work clothes and uniforms.

**BURLTHERM** — an acrylic lining applied in such a way as

to become a permanent part of drapery fabric. It provides insulation and makes draperies machine-washable, color fast, and shrinkage-resistant.

**CRANSHEEN** — a wrinkle- and-mildew-resistant resin finish that gives fabrics a soft, deep-seated lustre and the "feel" of satin.

**CYANA** — a wash-wear and shrinkage-control finish that causes cottons to retain their fit and shape — without sagging, stretching or wrinkling after repeated washing.

**HARRISET** — a process that eliminates "felting shrinkage"

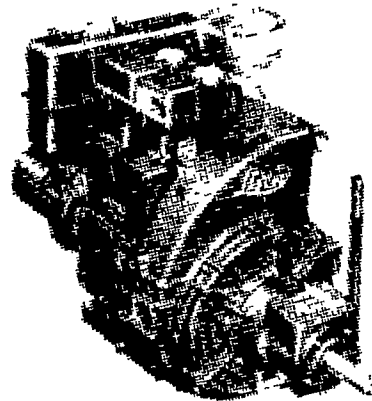
in wool so that garments retain their original size, shape and texture even when machine-laundred.

**PERM-A-PLUS** — a durable water-repellent, spot-and stain-resistant, soil-retardant, and wrinkle-resistant finish for rain-coats and other outerwear.

**ROXEL** — a permanent washable, fire-retardant treatment for mens' outer jackets and sweat-shirts.

**SCHOLLERIZED** — a chemical process that controls wool shrinkage and assures washability while still retaining its resiliency elasticity, softness, and texture; available in apparel and blankets.

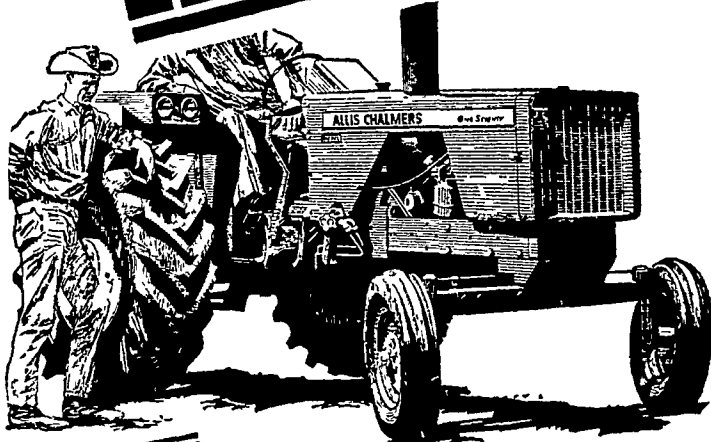
