**Plant Roses During Late Fall**

Roses can be planted during the late autumn or even into early winter, says a Pennsylvania State University correspondence course on rose gardening. Fall-planted roses need soil mounded about them 6 to 12 inches deep. A mulch should be added when winter weather becomes severe — for extra protection. For the rose course, send your name and address with two dollars to Roses Box 5000, University Park, Pa., 16802. There are no other charges and a complete course comes to you by mail. Make checks payable to The Pennsylvania State University.
