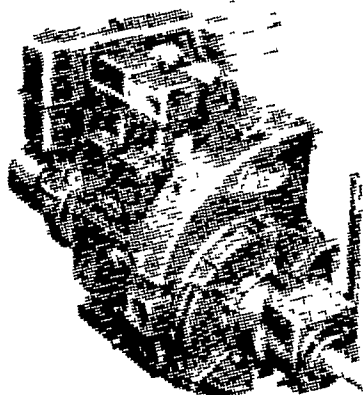

### Professor Says Ag Education Changing

High school agricultural programs in the 1970's will change from traditional emphasis on skills and abilities in farming to programs geared for all agricultural occupations, a Pennsylvania State University professor predicts.

This "people oriented" form of agricultural education will place increasing emphasis upon occupational guidance and career planning, states Dr. Norman K. Hoover, associate professor of agricultural education at Penn State. The "new look" will include orientation for post-high school education at all levels and adult education in all phases of the agricultural industry.

Many high schools are already carrying out supervised occupational programs for students preparing for off-farm agricultural occupations, he says. This often involves a co-

operative program between public schools and industry.

"Agricultural education has always been concerned with disadvantaged rural youth and particularly with farm youth. In the 1970's we will be concerned not only with the farm and rural disadvantaged — we will also be developing programs for the urban disadvantaged," he affirms.

With proper education, urban youth could fill many jobs in off-farm agricultural work, Dr. Hoover suggests. These urban youth are needed since there are not enough farm reared youth to fill all of the positions. Moreover, agricultural processing industries, ornamental horticulture, and other agricultural based industries are concentrated in large urban centers.

In training youth for off-farm agricultural occupations, seven areas of instruction have been defined. These are agricultural production or traditional farm production, agricultural supplies, agricultural mechanics, agricultural products, agricultural resources,

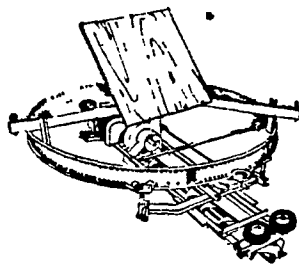
### Tip For Saving Money On Milk

A four-member family using the recommended 21 quarts of milk in a week can save more than \$4 a week by using nonfat dry milk instead of home delivered whole milk, reminds Harold E. Neigh, Penn State extension consumer economics specialist. The nonfat dry milk contains all the nutritive elements of whole fluid milk except vitamins A and D and has only half the calories. If that seems too drastic, you could mix equal amounts of nonfat fluid milk and whole fluid milk. This will also save money on the milk bill.

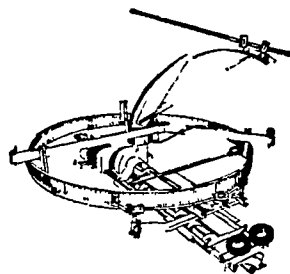

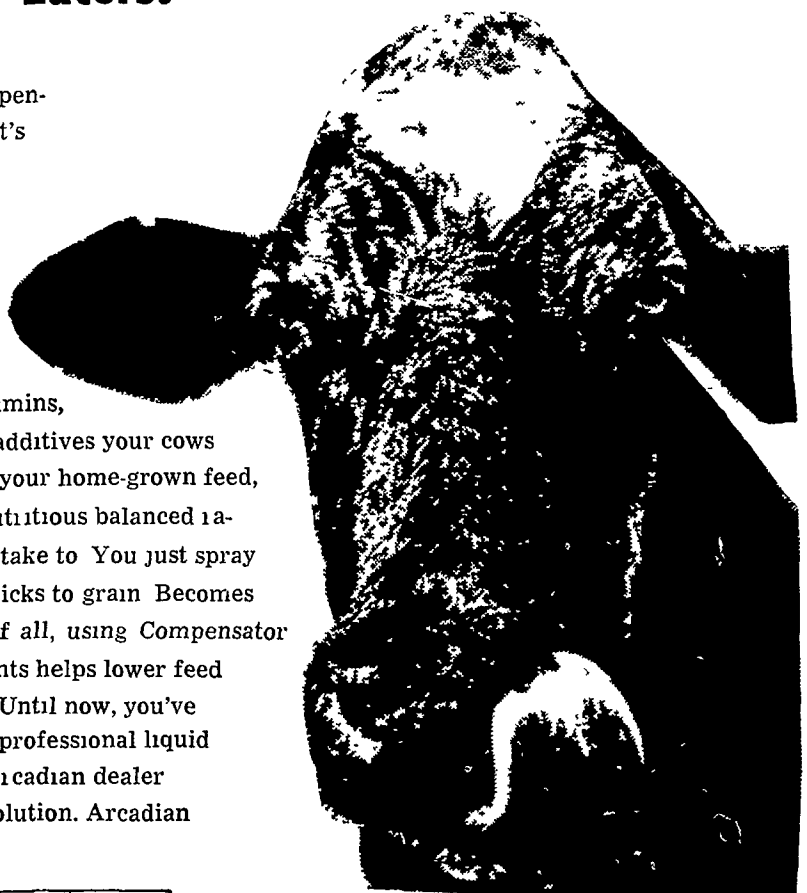
