told a group of farmers Monday that the mold, though not generally being found to have affected every part of a grower's crop, is different than the usual type that often appears in any given year because the mold this year is appearing on both sides of the leaf

"And it is not a case of just dropping the grade", he said, speaking at a special farmer information meetings at New Holland and East Petersburg "We are asking the farmer to keep it separate so we can get his good tobacco in a grade. Otherwise we have moldy tobacco scattered through every grade, and we can't have that. Keep the moldy tobacco dry and market it separately," he advised. He also said this was true whether the farmer was sorting or straight-strapping his crop

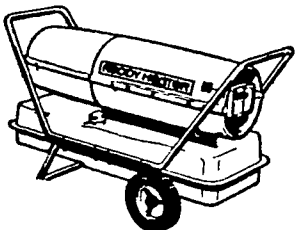
