**Blending and Mixing of Fibers**

Blending of fibers is done before spinning a yarn from exact proportions of different fibers, explains Mrs. Ruth Ann Wilson, Penn State extension clothing specialist. A blend may consist of synthetic and natural fibers, combinations of synthetics, or combinations of natural fibers. A fiber mixture is achieved after spinning by twisting together two or more strands of spun yarn or continuous filament. A fabric mixture may consist of a mixture of yarns or wrap yarns of one fiber and filling yarns of another fiber.

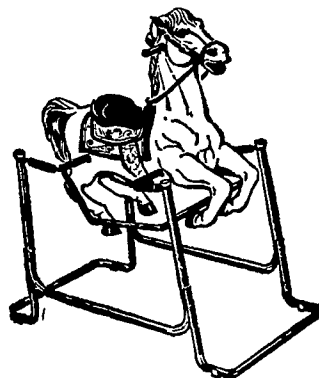
