Student Employment

Each summer there are a limited number of jobs for students made available in Federal agencies. Most positions are filled on a merit basis, and most, also, require eligibility through a

Civil Service examination. Any student interested in this kind of employment should get busy immediately on his or her application. The first step is to obtain a copy of the pamphlet, "Summer Jobs in Federal Agencies," which is available at college placement offices, U.S. Civil Service Commission offices, and first class post offices. I have a few

copies available in my District Office, too.

Museum Tours

If you are planning to visit the Nation's Capital for a weekend anytime soon, you might consider putting the free public tour of the National Museum of History and Technology on your agenda. Previously, visitors could wander through the displays on their own, but no tour service was available. Now the Junior League of Washington conducts tours on Saturdays and Sundays and will continue to do so through May, 1970. Saturday tours begin at 10:30 a.m., noon, 1:30 p.m., and 3:00 p.m., Sunday tours get underway at 1:30 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. And a reminder: If you're headed for Washington to see the sights, don't hesitate to call or write my office for help in making your plans.

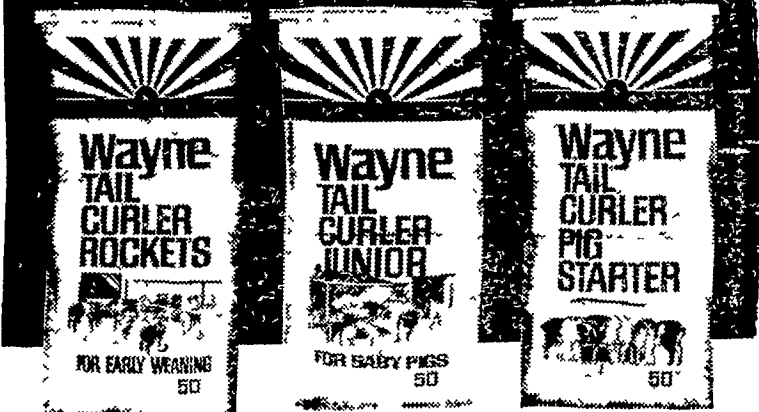

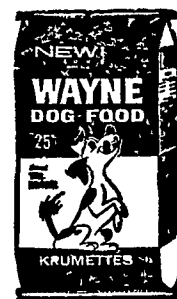
