Spots that resist whisk brooms and stiff clothes brushes will often come out when rubbed with a rubber sponge.

Paint spots on shoes can be removed if the head of a kitchen match is moistened and rubbed on the spots

If you get catsup stains on washable clothing, sponge them with clear, cold water before putting in the regular laundry

For mustard stains try getting the spots off with ginger ale

John Huston Named Sec. Of Beef Council

John L. Huston has been named Secretary of the Beef Industry Council of the National Live Stock and Meat Board. Official announcement of the appointment followed the December 9 meeting of the Beef Industry Council in Chicago. Huston also succeeds his predecessor, Donald E. Walker, as the Meat Board's Vice President for Beef Programs, according to David H. Stroud, President of the Board.

Huston joined the staff as Council assistant in 1967. Walker resigned September 1, 1969, to accept a position with a commodities brokerage firm.

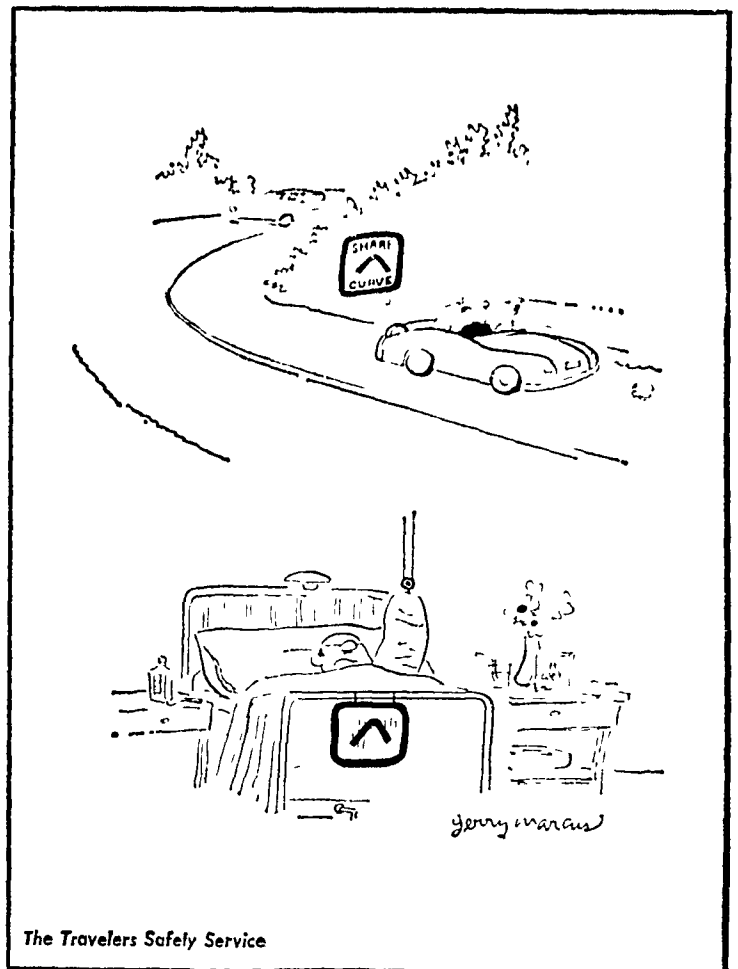
As Secretary of the Beef Industry Council, Huston administers creation and execution of programs designed to increase and strengthen dollar demand for beef and beef cattle. As Vice President, Beef Program, Huston is part of the Board's executive management group. He will help guide all departments in projects relating to beef in the Board's over-all program of promotion, education, information, research and merchandising. About 55.58 percent of the Board's income is derived from the beef cattle segment of the industry and a like percentage is budgeted to beef projects.

A native of Roseville, Illinois, where he grew up on a livestock farm, Huston worked as a vocational agriculture instructor at the Henry, Illinois, high school before joining the Chicago-based Meat Board.

Huston graduated from the University of Illinois' College of Agriculture in 1963, gaining a B.S. degree in agricultural education. While attending the U of I, he was a member of both the livestock and meat judging teams and was high individual
