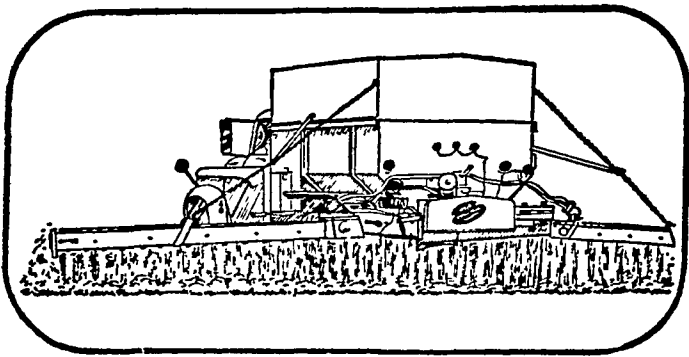

cover acres of land. 3 Using electric lights to supplement solar energy in crop production areas 4 Using radio controls to match the operation of irrigation systems with power availability 5 Use of all-electric crop conditioning systems to keep shelled corn and other perishables from spoiling 6 Use of waste heat from nuclear power stations for soil warming, irrigation, and greenhouse heating

Turel concluded by predicting that electricity would continue to be a low-priced energy for agricultural use He said that developments such as fast-breeder reactors and automated meter reading would help to offset the effects of inflation, and of increased spending by electric power suppliers to reduce pollution and improve the appearance and reliability of their systems.

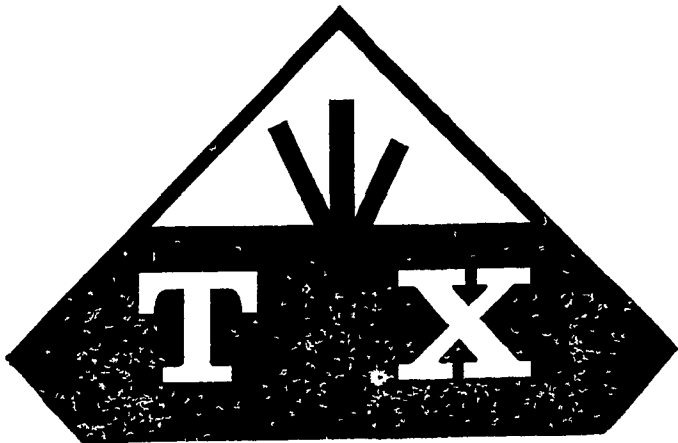

Garden Spot Young Farmers Futures Meet Set January 13

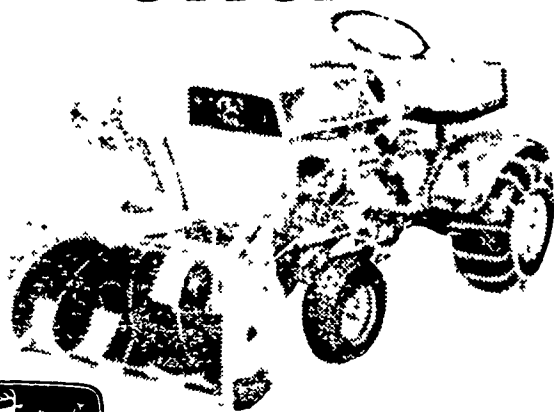
