PENNSYLVANIA BROILER PLACEMENTS UP 24%

Placements of broiler chicks in the Commonwealth during the week ending December 27 were 1,011,000. The placements were 24% above the same week a year earlier and 7% below the previous week. Average placements during the past 10 weeks were 17% above a year earlier. Settings for broiler chicks were 1,782,000 — 1% below the previous week and 11% above the comparable period a year earlier. The current 3-week total of eggs set is 16% above the same period a year ago. In shipments of broiler-type chicks during the past 10 weeks averaged 17,000, compared with 21,000 a year ago. Outshipments averaged 308,000 during the past 10 weeks, 15% above a year earlier.

22 STATES: Placements in the 22 States were 52,634,000 — 5% below the previous week and 11% above the same week a year earlier. Average placements during the past 10 weeks were 12% above a year ago. Settings were 73,561,000 — slightly above the previous week and 15% above a year earlier. The current 3-week total of eggs set is 14% above the comparable period a year ago.

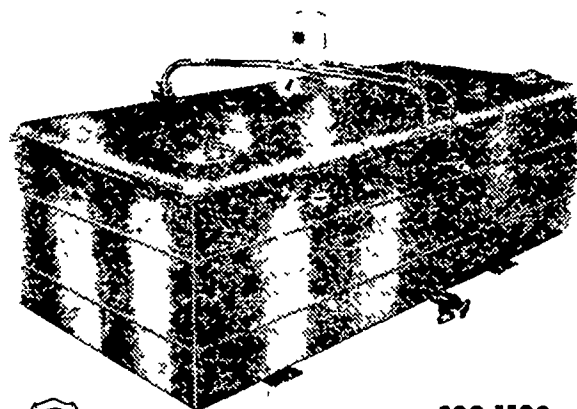
