Advance interest developing very slow as a wait and see attitude prevails. Live supplies ample to occasional

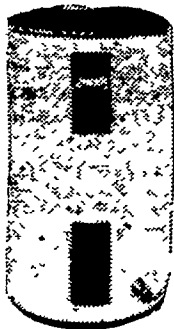
