

Garden Spot Economics Department To Participate At Farm Show

The Garden Spot High School home economics department has been selected to participate in the Agricultural and Homemaking School Exhibit Contest at the Farm Show next week. They are one of nine Pennsylvania high school departments to be selected.

Horace L. Mann Farm Show director, reports this will be the 47th in the annual series in which school home economics window exhibits have been entered in competition. Prize money totals \$435.

The schools were chosen by a state committee after reviewing applications submitted by school home economics departments from throughout the state. Each window exhibit will convey one central idea based on an approved method or practice in one of the five major areas of home economics education. Top prize is \$75 and each entry will receive an award of at least \$40.

A special award of \$50 will be presented by the Pennsylvania Electric Association for the exhibit which demonstrates the best practical use of electricity.

The nine schools, each from different counties, were certified to the Farm Show Commission by Miss Anne G. Eifler, state supervisor, Consumer and Homemaking Education, Department of Education.
