1 cup Cheddar cheese, grated
2 cups cooked peas

Brown ground beef and onion Blend in soups. Place half of mixture in casserole, add peas then add remaining mixture. Add Worcestershire sauce and top with cheese. Bake for 15 minutes in 350 degree oven. Serve on buttered toast, English muffins or mashed potatoes. Yield, 6 servings. Corn may be used instead of peas.

These could be served with the above recipe or almost any meal.

CHEESE POTATO PUFFS

12 medium potatoes
6 tablespoons butter
2 1/2 cups grated Cheddar cheese
1 to 1 1/4 cups milk
1/2 teaspoon salt
2 eggs beaten

Peel potatoes, cook and mash thoroughly. Add butter, milk, salt and cheese. Beat over low heat. Fold in beaten eggs. Pour into greased pan or dish and bake in moderate oven (350 degrees) for 30 to 45 minutes.

1 1/2 cups sugar
2 eggs
1 cup dairy sour cream
1/2 teaspoon vanilla
1/4 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon baking powder
2 cups sifted cake flour
1/2 cup chopped pecans
2 tablespoons brown sugar
1 teaspoon instant cocoa mix

Cream butter and sugar. Add eggs. Cream again. Fold in sour cream and vanilla. Sift together salt, baking powder and flour. Fold into creamed mixture. Mix nuts, brown sugar, cocoa mix and cinnamon. Spoon batter into greased and floured 9 inch tube pan. Top with nut mixture. Bake in 350 degree oven 50 to 60 minutes. Cook cake in pan 20 minutes before removing it.

SUPER DUPER CHOCOLATE COOKIES

1/2 cup shortening
4 squares unsweetened chocolate

2 cups sugar
2 teaspoons vanilla
4 eggs, unbeaten
2 cups flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup chopped nuts
confectioners' sugar

Melt shortening and chocolate, to 15 minutes. Makes about 6 add sugar and vanilla, mix well. dozen.

Add eggs, singly, beating after each. Sift together flour, baking powder and salt. Add to chocolate mixture with nuts, mix well. Chill dough several hours.

Form into small balls, roll in confectioners' sugar. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees) 12

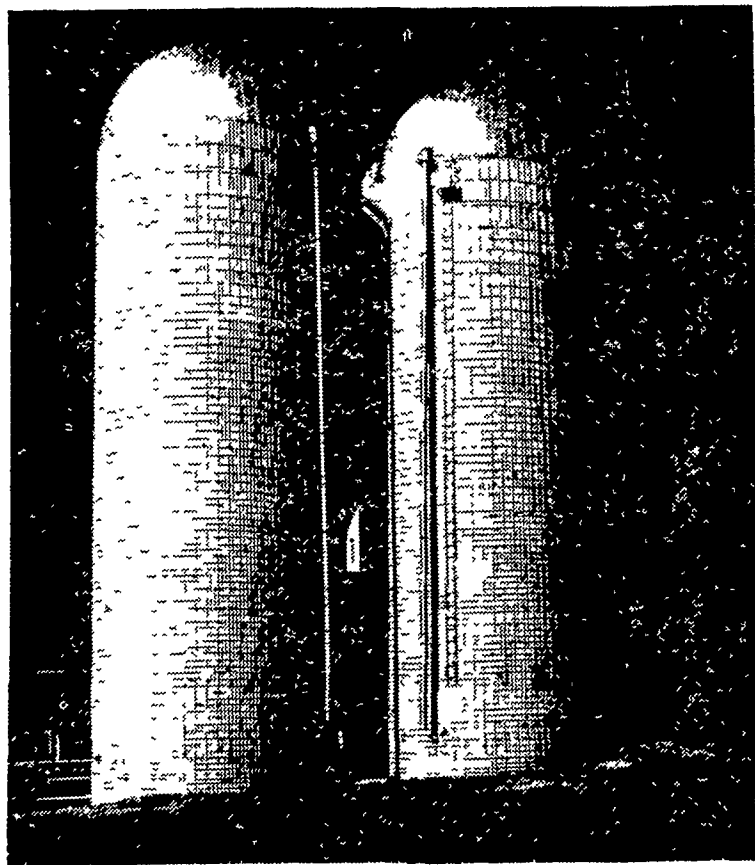
