## Local Holstein Entries Few At Farm Show

**HARRISBURG** — Local entries in the Holstein show here at the Farm Show, Tuesday, were scarce and championships won by County breeders were nonexistent. The Robert Kauffman family, Elizabethtown R1, The Richard Hess family and the Edwin Hess Jr. family, both of Strasburg R1 had the only local entries in the show.

Edwin Hess had the second place dry aged cow in the Junior Division and Susan Kauffman had the third place in the Junior Division of the Junior Yearling Heifer Class. Robert Kauffman had the second place produce of dam and the local Holstein breeders put together the third place County Group of Five.

Spring Valley Farms, of Argyle, York County, exhibiting Woodbine Ivanhoe Mollie, a 7-year-old cow, walked off with championship honors. The animal was earlier judged senior champion. Last year a Spring

Valley Farms entry captured the bull championship.

Championship bull honors went to Lime Rock B.R. Penstac, a calf owned by Hubert S. Miller, of Myerstown, Lebanon County. Another Miller entry, Lime Rock Maquis Jake, a yearling, was judged reserve bull champion.

Allen Dairy Farms, Inc., of Mechanicsburg, RD 2, Cumberland County, showing Monocacy Meadows Kay Model, a 3 year-old won the reserve female championship. The animal was also selected as reserve senior champion.

Junior champion was Pleasant State Orboindale Royal, a senior yearling exhibited by Michael Chronister, of York, RD 7, a 4 H member. The Chronister animal also was judged reserve champion in the junior division.

Reserve junior champion was a senior yearling, Kingway Beauty Deedee, exhibited by Kingway Farms, of Delta, RD 2, York County.

The premier exhibit award was won by Spring Valley Farms and the premier breeder award was presented to Kingway Farms.
