The greatest danger isn't that we will not transmit it.

"If we skin off 13 to 15 per cent of the young population, we get rid of all the kooks, draft card burners, etc. That leaves 85 to 87 per cent of the young people who are OK. We have a lot of people who are telling it like it isn't. Young Americans must learn good manners which the Doctor called elementary citizenship No 1 and legitimate restraints.

"In all age levels we have too many 'instant big-shots' who want to arrive before they have taken the trip. You don't make

a case for America, you just reveal it.

"Equality in Americans never meant equality in achievement. It always meant equality of opportunity. When you have had the opportunity you have had equality," McFarland said.

President Donald Hoin said the large crowd at the affair was an expression of a united industry.

Secretary of Agriculture, Leland Bull, said he was getting a lot of compliments on the poultry exhibit at the Farm Show and Miss Becky Jo Fitz told of her experiences of life on a poultry farm.

Hendrik Wentink, one of the motivating forces behind the fund raising affair served as the toastmaster.
