sed consumer approval of porktaste, provided information to offset consumer anxieties about pork and called attention to the increasing availability of the rewer, leaner pork being produced on the nation's faims

According to J Marvin Garner, Exec Vice-President of the Pork Council, a recent but fast-grow ing commodity promotion organ-12ation undertook the measurement of advertising effectiveness because relatively little is known about the actual impact of media Eavertising on non-branded products The pork industry from producer to packer to retailer is determined to compete strongly for consumer attention and purchase of pork Our earlier consamer research had pointed c early to a consumer reluctance based on concern about pork's purity, its keeping qualities, its fat content and convenience in cooking Fortunately, most of these anxieties are based on vague attitudes having little bas-15 in fact Our research has snown we believe, that the homemaker will accept the facts about pork, will change her mind cout the product and will buy 1' more regularly


