

**Chicken Eating Now Exceeds Eggs**

Twenty years ago, per capita consumption of eggs was more than double that of poultry. In 1968, however, the pounds of poultry eaten per person in the United States was somewhat greater than that of eggs according to the USDA's Farm Index. In 1948, it was estimated that

per capita poultry consumption was 218 pounds. Because of efficiencies developed in the broiler industry, this increased to 452 pounds of poultry eaten per person in 1968.

Eggs, on the other hand, dropped from 478 pounds per person in 1948 to a per capita consumption of 40.5 pounds in 1968.

**Odors A Problem In Drying Manure**

With so much attention across the nation being focused on air pollution, poultrymen may find more complaints directed against them because of manure odors.

Even with artificial manure drying equipment, odors are still a problem.

"No one has come up with a solution for eliminating odors from gasified dehydrators," declared W. C. Fairbank, extension agricultural engineer, University of California, Riverside, at the Pacific Southwest Annual Nutrition Conference. Deodorants and neutralizers have been tried with questionable results.

"Odors are the most difficult problem we have, as I see it," Fairbank said further. "These odors can be present in only two or three parts per billion, and they'll still be repulsive to the neighborhood. But the ironic thing is that nearby the odors won't be noticed while two or three miles away, people will be calling the health department to find out what the smell is."

Bert Maxwell, nutritionist at Goldman's Egg City, commented on research in Pennsylvania and Michigan where it was shown that fresh manure a day or two old did not have the odors of manure that had been under cages three or four months.

**Buy Good Seed**

In making up your garden seed order include the old standbys along with some promising new varieties, advises Robert F. Fletcher, Extension vegetable specialist at The Pennsylvania State University. It may be a good idea to order your seed soon to be sure of having them when you are ready to plant.

**Napalm**

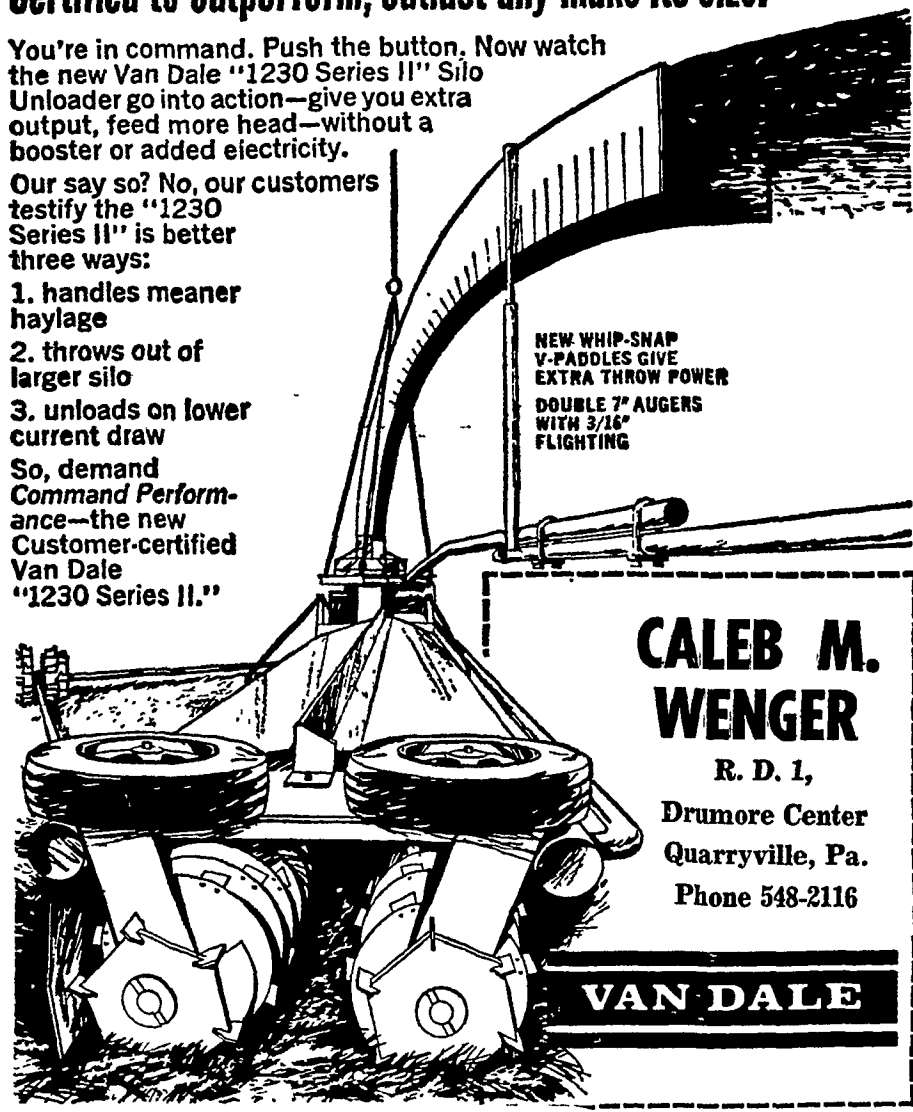
