No one has come up with a solution for eliminating odors from gasfired dehydrators," de-Clared W. C. Fan bank, extension agricultural engineer. University of California, Riverside, at the Pacific Southwest Animal Nutrition Conference Deodorants and neutralizers have been tried with questionable results

*Odors are the most difficult problem we have, as I see it," Fairbank said further. "These odors can be present in only two o three parts per billion, and trey'll still be repulsive to the reighborhood But the ironic thing is that nearby the odors won't be noticed while two or three miles away, people will be calling the health department to find out what the smell is."

Bert Maxwell, nutritionist at Goldman's Egg City, commented on research in Pennsylvania and Michigan where it was shown that fresh manure a day or two old did not have the odors of manure that had been under cages three or four months.
