

Memorial Fund Established For Mrs. Miles

A memorial to the late Kathryn Bele Niles, who served the poultry industry with dedication for over 25 years, is being established in the new headquarters building of the American Home Economics Association in Washington, D. C.

Fourteen past presidents of the Poultry and Egg National Board have been contacted to hold stir interest and aid in the collection of funds for this

memorial. Mrs. Niles, who served as Director of Home Economics at the Board for 21 years, was permanently enshrined in the Poultry Hall of Fame in 1965.

The funds will be used in a specific place in the AHEA headquarters building now under construction on historic Massachusetts Avenue, N. W., in the Nation's Capitol. A suitable plaque will be used to designate the memorial. The exact use will be determined by the amount of funds collected.

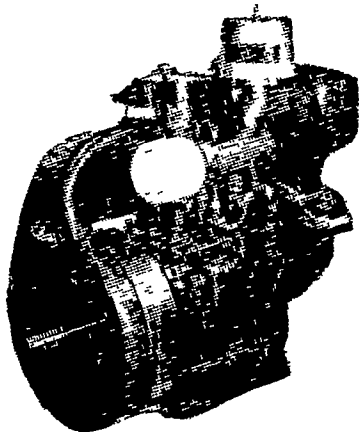

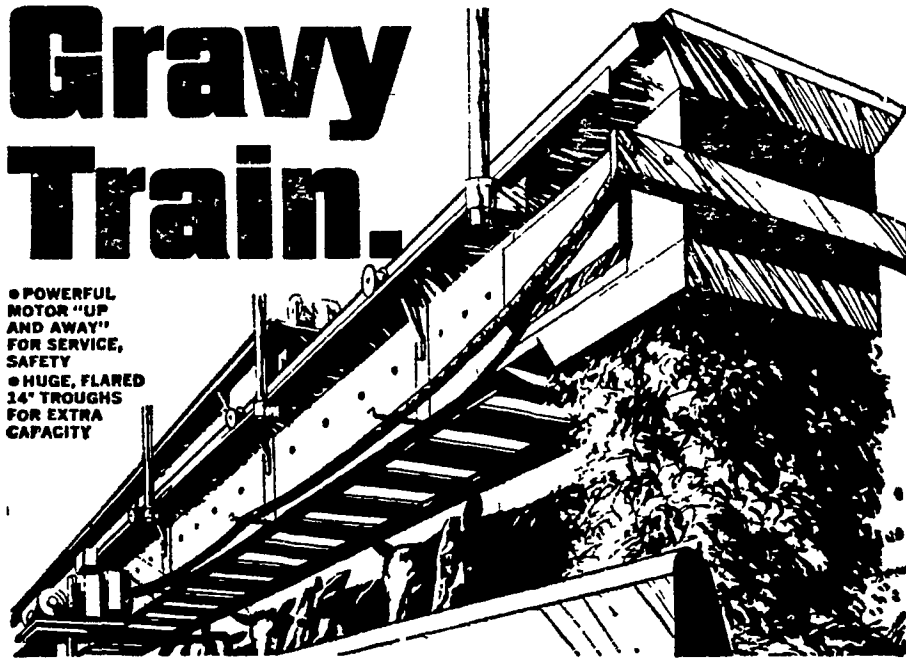
