

decreased This announcement was made by Robert M. Stebbins, Superintendent of the Registry Department of Holstein-Filesian Association of Brattleboro, Vt - For the America as a part of the Astivities for 1969

Stebbins stated that 68 4% of all Holstein registrations during the past year were of animals that were artificially conceived through one of several categories of insemination by artificial means This compares with 694% of the Holstein registrations in 1968 and the all time high of 70 5% in 1967 Holstein legistrations of AI conceived animals has exceeded 68% of total Holstein registrations since 1965

A total of 261,144 Holsteins were registered by the Association during 1969 Of this number, 178,528 were artificially conceived Most of the conceptions were the result of services provided Holstein dairymen by established bull studs or semen producing businesses This accounted for 6176% of the Holstein registrations The 1emaining number resulted from breedings between established bieeder-heids and within the heid of the owner of the sire and dam

The five year level of 68% to 70% of registrations of artificially conceived animals suggests that this might be the leveling off point within the purebred Registered Holstein sector of the damy industry Although no specific information is available, it is believed that the remaining 30% of the registiations of naturally conceived animals is composed pijmarily of the offspring of first calf heifers
