meetings conducted by the leaders and attended by 10,896. There were 72 program planning meetings with an attendance of 620. 35,612 attended 697 Extension staff meetings. Other meetings the staff attended reached 34,680 people. There were 77 4-H clubs functioning last year with

a total of 2,024 boys and girls participating in 2410 projects. 322 4-H Leaders were largely responsible for carrying on the work of these clubs under the direction of the County Extension workers. Mrs. Doris Thomas reported that the Extension service has served Lancaster County for 57 years. The interest in workshops has increased to the point that six teachers had to be hired the past year to help conduct them and a small charge was made for attendance in order to serve everyone. All the workshops were conducted in the Farm and Home Center. They will be reaching 20,000 fourth and fifth graders this year through TV on Saturday afternoons, stimulating 4-H work.

March. He said DDT and 2-4-5T (brush killer) herbicide have been banned due to their chemical carry-over qualities and cautioned farmers that a new federal Child Labor Law prevents a boy or girl from 14 to 16 years of age from driving a tractor on a neighbors farm unless they have a card of certification to do so. He stated that Lancaster County has the largest 4-H enrollment in the state. They have 10% less Extension workers in the state than ten years ago. Last year the federal government provided funds for work in foods and nutrition in low income communities of 20 counties and will provide greater funds this year.

**4-H Award**  
Jay Irwin presented Dr. Robert F. Eshleman with the State 4-H Alumni Recognition plaque for 1969. This is conducted by the Cooperative Extension Service and the plaque is made available by Olin Mathieson Chemical Corporation. Candidates are selected by the Pennsylvania State University Extension Service. Dr. Eshleman is Professor of Sociology at Franklin and Marshall College. This year he is on leave and is a visiting research fellow at the University of Glasgow, Scotland. He had six years experience in 4-H work in Lancaster County and was cited for his continuing work with youth and education, having served in many capacities locally and internationally.

Mr. and Mrs. Robert C. Groff, Quarryville R3, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Kauffman, Elizabethtown R1 and Mr. and Mrs. Arthur W. Longenecker, Drumore R1 were recognized for hosting IFY students. Dr. William H. Duncan, President of Millersville State College, for the past one and half years spoke on the topic "Public Higher Education In The Commonwealth of Pa. And Who It Serves". He referred to four areas our tax money is used to support: 1-13 State Colleges and 1 University owned, maintained and operated by the State of Pa. 2-State related colleges: University of Pittsburg, Temple and Penna State University. 3-14 or 15 State supported schools which the state helps to support but has no control over. And 4-Community Colleges. A fifth area is scholarships and loan grants to students attending college in and out of the state. Also the state has a strong privately supported higher education system. Presently 5100 students are enrolled at Millersville State College. Dr. Duncan says "Praise the Lord for the generation gap. We expect change. There are threats to our way of life but that is a minority group. We have to learn to work with those who are trying to make a change."
