Wheat, Feed Grain

Pennsylvania farmers have signed up 94,729 acres under the 1970 feed grain program and 33,989 acres under the wheat program, according to figures released this week by the U S Department of Agriculture

The figures, however, represent only the first two weeks in of the Feb 2 - March 20 signup period. Nationwide, 149 million acres have been signed up under the feed grain program and 65 million acres under the wheat allotment program.
