USDA Buys Juice

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has announced an offer to buy canned apple juice, U.S. Grade A, processed from apples of the 1969 crop, for distribution to needy families

USDA's Consumer and Marketing Service said that purchases will be made on an offer and acceptance basis, using funds authorized under Section 32 of Public Law 78-320. The apple juice is to be fortified with vitamin C to help improve the nutritional level of foods donated to needy families. Details and specifications are being mailed to canners.

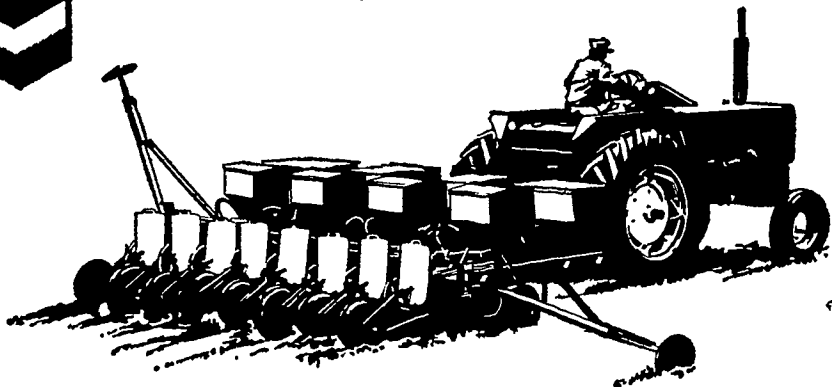

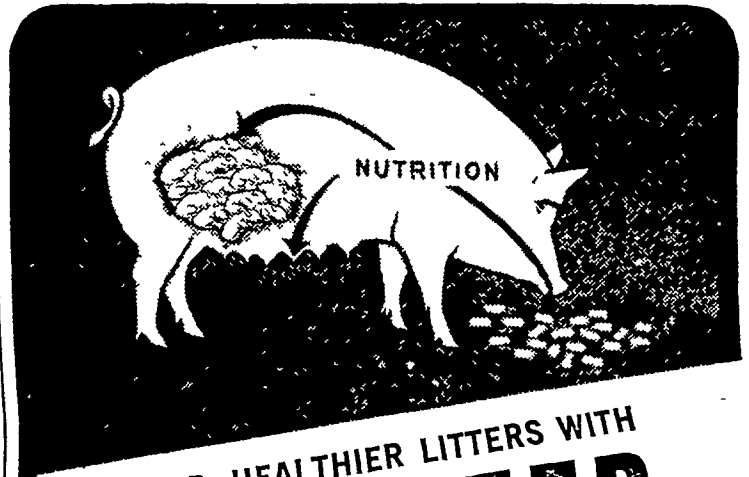

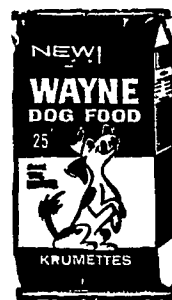
