for beef producers in 1969, and it turned out to be one of the best on record.

Why was he so wrong? He misjudged the American consumer and the extent to which inflation would take over the economy.

Moore had projected increased spending power for 1969 of three per cent, but it was actually about six per cent.

Moore had projected beef demand for 1969 would rise three per cent, but it went up five per cent.

Moore had assumed that if beef prices went up, then beef consumption would fall. Prices went up, but the consumer bought more beef than ever before.

Slides showed that in 1955 per capita beef consumption in this country was 82 pounds, it jumped to 99.3 in 1965, 109 in 1968 and 110.7 pounds per person in 1969

Pa 450, designed for statewide use, husks cleaner and easier than Pa 444, an older hybrid, and compares favorably with Pa 444 in yield and ability to withstand stalk rot.

Pa 450 has good resistance to smut, leaf blight, aphids, and the European corn borer. Dr. McKee points out, it responds well to thick planting rates and high fertility. Pa 450 was developed by Dr. Walter I. Thomas and Dr. George W. Gorsline.
