## USDA Changes Hog Cholera Indemnity

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has changed hog cholera indemnity regulations to permit payment of full Federal indemnity for swine which have moved interstate and which must be destroyed because of hog cholera.

The notice of the change in the hog cholera indemnity regulations was slated to become effective February 25.

Under the new regulations, the ARS Animal Health Division is authorized to pay full Federal indemnities for swine destroyed because of hog cholera which have met these conditions: (1) The swine actually moved interstate; (2) The interstate movement was made in compliance with State and Federal shipping rules; (3) The swine were exposed to hog cholera either during or prior to the interstate movement; (4) The receiving State has required the swine to be

maintained in isolation and quarantine as a separate unit for at least 30 days. (5) Hog cholera occurred during the isolation and quarantine period imposed by the State, and (6) In States which impose a quarantine period for longer than 30 days, full Federal indemnity would be paid only when infection is found during the first 60 days of quarantine.

Dr. Ernest E. Saulmon, Director of the Animal Health Division, explained that in all other instances where hog cholera occurs and farmers qualify for indemnity payments, indemnities are shared on a matching basis with the States.

He emphasized that to be eligible for full Federal indemnity payment, imported hogs must be properly isolated from native hogs. If not properly isolated, indemnities will be paid from matching State and Federal funds, as before.

All but two States — Main and New York — are now engaged in final stamping out activities against hog cholera. This involves prompt and complete disposal of all infected and exposed herds with indemnities to help compensate owners for their losses.

### Grain Supplies Up

Stocks of all grains in the Commonwealth totaled 90.7 million bushels on January 1. This compares with 82 million bushels on the same date a year ago. Feed grain stocks including corn, oats and barley increased 12 percent, while food grains including wheat and rye rose two percent, according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service.

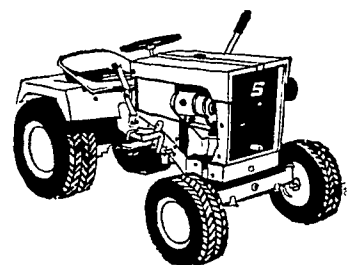
