Tuesday, March 10, Ed Sauders of the Atlantic Breeders Cooperative will discuss

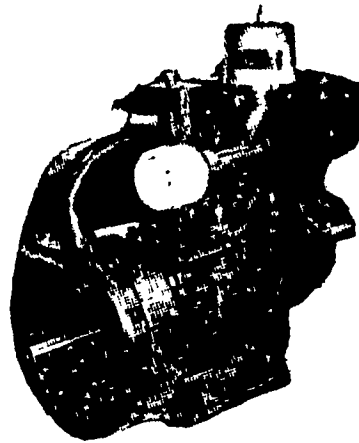
proper mating, including sire selection principles and pedigrees.

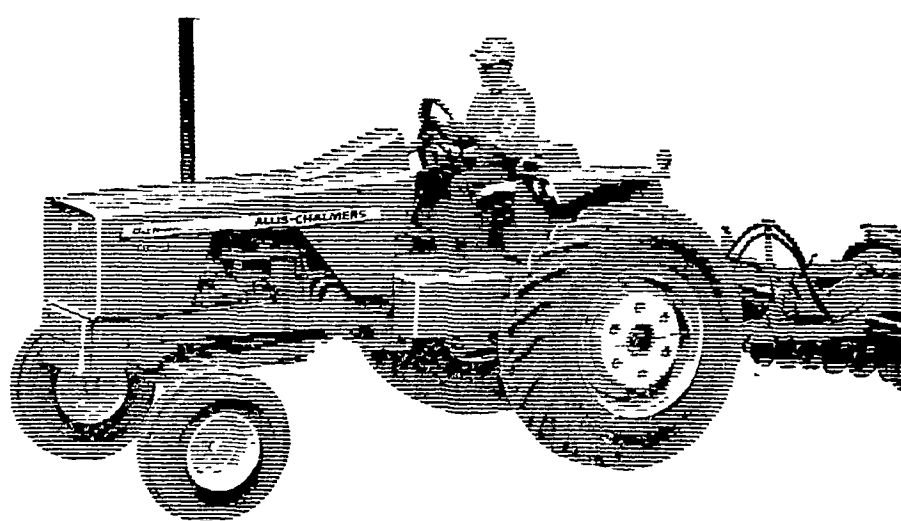
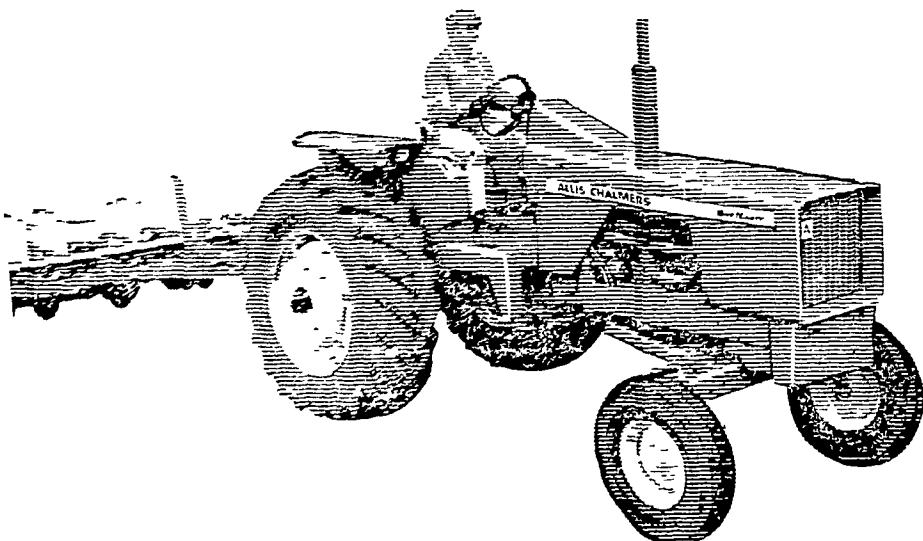
