Affecting all taxpayers are increases in the personal and dependency exemptions Formerly S600 each, they are scheduled to increase to \$625 for 1970, \$630 tor 1971, 700 for 1972, and \$750 tor 1973 and subsequent years

Another change of large general interest is the increase in the percentage standard deduction Presently 10% with a maximum of \$1,000, it is scheduled to in crease to 13% with a maximum of \$1,500 for 1971, 14'c and \$2, 000 for 1972 and 15% and \$2,000 toi 1973 and subsequent years These increases will have the effect of reversing a trend under which an increasing number of individuals were discontinuing the standard deduction in favor of itemizing deductions

Accompanying the increases in the percentage standard deduction is a new low income allowance, the effect of which is to provide a tax exemption for low income taxpayers which is even larger than that afforded by the percentage standard deduction After a phasing in piocess, the low income allowance will be S1,000 in 1972 and following years, so that in 1972 a single person will pay no tax on his first \$1 700 of income (\$1 000) low income allowance, plus \$700 personal exemption) In 1973 and


