Lancaster County farmers received more than three quarters of a million dollars for participating in federal programs in 1969. While substantial, the federal payments represent less than one per cent of county farm income, however. In 1968, county farmers had income totaling more than \$124,000,000 from crops and livestock.

The \$757,026 of federal monies include \$643,156 in various subsidy and diversion payments, primarily to wheat and feed grains, and \$113,870 under the agricultural conservation program.

Distribution of the \$643,156 is as follows:

**WHEAT PROGRAM** — A total of 825 farmers received additional wheat income of \$235,060 through certificate payments on 3342 acres of wheat and \$28,641 for diversion of 825 acres of wheat allotment.

**FEED GRAIN** — The service paid 348 farm owners \$182,945 for diversion of 3,736 acres from corn, 12 acres from grain sorghum and 242 acres of barley. Price support payment of \$31,733 was made for 1,505 acres of feed grain grown.

**CROPLAND ADJUSTMENT** — Seven farmers earned diversion payments of \$6,410 on 228 acres of cropland retired into permanent cover. Two of the farms received an additional \$3 per acre for permitting public access for hunting and hiking on 20 acres.

**WOOL PROGRAM** — Payment of \$6,389 was made in 1969 to 93 farmers for wool and unshorn lambs sold during the 1968 marketing year.

**CONSERVATION RESERVE** — A single farm earned \$87 for maintaining four acres in grass cover.

**PRICE SUPPORT LOANS** — Fifty-eight farmers received \$44,663 on 35,491 bushels of wheat stored in local warehouses and six farmers received \$4,061 for 3,270 bushels of wheat stored on the farm.

One farmer received \$3,162 for 3,000 bushels of corn stored on the farm.

Breakdown of the \$113,870, included this week in the Lancaster County Soil and Water District annual report, shows:

Establishing permanent grass cover (lime, seed and fertilizer), 117 farms, 1,302 acres, \$14,757; contour strip-cropping and hedge-row removal, 14 farms, 259 acres, \$2,392; improving established cover (lime and fertilizer), 95 farms, 1,868 acres, \$18,404.

Spring or seep for livestock water, one farm one spring, \$313; ponds for agricultural use three farms, three ponds \$2,400; establishing sod waterways, 48 acres, \$3,802; feed, \$26,919.

Establishing permanent cover to protect diversion ditch banks etc., 16 farms, 20 acres, \$874; constructing cropland terraces 33 farms, 150,372 feet, \$24,444; constructing diversion terrace 11

#### New Poultry Waterer

The Pennsylvania Poultry Federation states in its February news letter "Initial reports from producers are very good on the New Mono-flow German Waterer which is a drip type waterer sold by Keen Manufacturing Co., Millville, N.J. It does not leak yet gives birds adequate water. The cleanliness of this new waterer is phenomenal, which is not true of some individual cup type waterers now being used."

The cups collect up to two to 14 per cent of dry matter by weight which is "Feed residue, microorganisms, mold, slime and general unnecessary garbage."

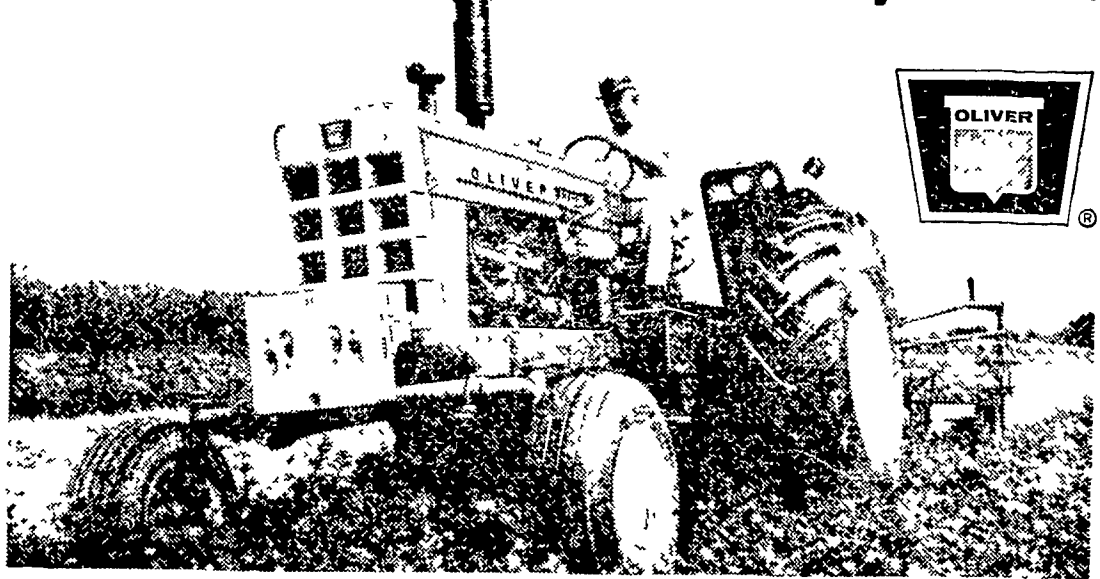
In addition \$5,150 of the 1961 ACP allocation was transferred to Soil Conservation Service for technical services needed in establishing permanent type conservation practices.
