Weekly Review

CATTLE — Compared with last Friday, slaughter steers 50-75 lower, Slaughter heifers 25-50 lower, Cows fully steady. Bulls 25 50 higher

Receipts 67 percent slaughter steers and 28 percent slaughter heifers with balance mostly cows. Overall finish slaughter steers more attractive than last week with 20 percent Prime and 70 percent Choice, compared with 14 percent Prime and 70 percent Choice last week and 11 percent Prime and 74 percent Choice last year. Average cost and weight slaughter steers estimated at 31 90 and 1195 lbs, compared with 32.20 and 1201 lbs last week and 30 36 and 1148 lbs last year. Heifer supply mostly High Good to Low Prime weighing 850-1050 lbs.

SLAUGHTER STEERS — Prime 1200-1400 lbs. Yield Grade 3 and 4 33 00-33 50 with couple loads 1200-1275 lbs at 33 75 on Monday. Mixed High Choice and Prime 1150-1400 lbs. (Continued on Page 3)
