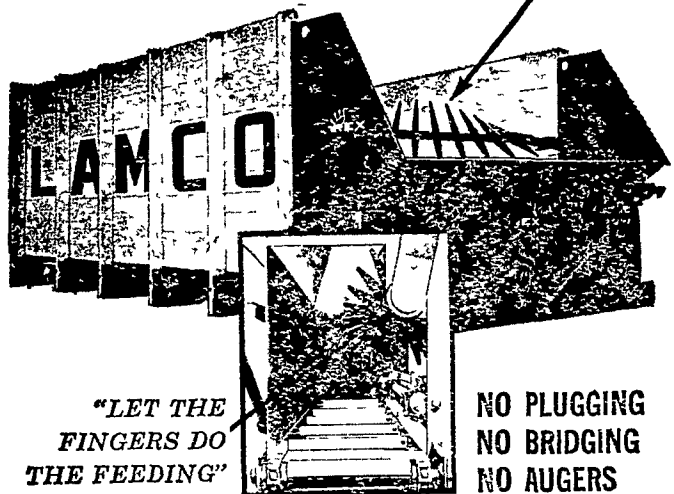

## New Twin-Row Planting May Raise Crop Yields

The yield advantages of nar-  
row row corn and beans have  
been documented

More evenly distributed  
plants, better use of light en-  
ergy, and quicker shading to  
smother weeds and conserve  
moisture are some of the rea-  
sons why the 20s and 30s may  
beat the old 40-inch spacings

Now, a few Corn Belt farm-  
ers are trying a new planting  
scheme engineered to give them  
all the advantages of narrow  
rows without taking away their  
freedom to cultivate and use  
conventional row crop equip-  
ment

Called paired-row or twin  
row planting it amounts to put-  
ting two rows side by side  
leaving more space for tractor  
tires between pairs. Is it worth  
the trouble of reshuffling your  
planter and cultivator?

Some farmers are convinced  
it is.
