

A View From The Governor's Office

Prompt implementation of Project 500 and a speedup of recreational construction by the Department of Forests and Waters will result in the opening this year of four new State Parks and additional facilities at five others. Included is the largest and most ambitious land reclamation project ever undertaken in the Commonwealth — 15,921-acre Moaine State Park and Lake Arthur in Butler County.

Also scheduled for opening are a boat-launching ramp and 158-slip marina at the new Neshaminy State Park in Bucks County; boat-launching, parking and administrative facilities at Codorus State Park in York County and the Falls Overlook area, parking lot and concession buildings at Ohioyle State Park in Fayette and Somerset Counties.

In addition, a total of 608 new camping sites will be available this summer, 437 of them at Prince Gallitzin State Park in Cambria County and the remaining 171 at Laurel Hill in Somerset County. Other facilities expected to be opened this year are at Cuiwensville in Clearfield County, Ricketts Glen in Luzerne County, and Ryerson Station in Greene County.

The fact that so many new State facilities for outdoor recreation will be opened to public use this season is the result of the far-sighted policy of the people of Pennsylvania in approving both Project 70 under which the land was purchased and Project 500 under which it is now being developed.

(Project 70 is a \$70 million bond issue for the purchase of lands for recreational purposes approved by the voters in 1963, and Project 500, a \$500 million bond issue for land reclamation and development approved only three years ago.)

The fact that Moaine State Park will be formally opened to the public sometime around Memorial Day is, moreover, strong evidence of this Administration's determination to both reclaim and restore lands previously ruined by past coal mining practices.

One of the largest in the State Park system, Moaine itself is the result of cooperative efforts on the part of the Departments of Mines and Mineral Industries and Forests and Waters to eliminate and control acid mine drainage and other harmful effects of both strip and deep mining of the land on which it is located.

In developing Moaine, scores of mine refuse piles had to be removed, 422 old oil, gas and water wells plugged, 58 deep mine openings sealed and acres of abandoned strip mines back filled and planted in grasses and trees before the dam creating Lake Arthur could be closed.

Although no definite date has been set for the opening, the 3,225 acre lake will be completely filled by Memorial Day, and some of its planned boating and swimming facilities available for use at that time.

Moraine facilities ready for opening this spring include a marina with dock space for 355 boats, three boat-launching ramps, a swimming beach and bathhouses, picnic and parking areas and several building housing both food and service concessions.

A detailed listing of other facilities at other State Parks scheduled for use this summer follows.

Curwensville State Park, Clearfield County Boat-launching and mooring facilities, parking area, new toilet facilities, water treatment and a storage and distribution system, and drinking fountains.

Laurel Hill State Park, Somerset County. An additional 171 camp sites as well as modern sanitary facilities and washhouse. This will increase the number of camp sites here to 268.

Prince Gallitzin State Park,

Cambria County: A new camping area with 437 camp sites, camp store, washhouses and beach plus boat-launching and mooring facilities for campers. Also under construction are day-use facilities which include a parking area, comfort station, change house and boat rental area adjacent to the existing beach.

Ricketts Glen State Park, Luzerne County: Water and sanitary facilities.

Ryerson Station State Park,

Greene County: A new swimming pool and bathhouse.
