

# Feds Now Stress Farm Storage

Secretary of Agriculture Cliff Hardin has announced 1969 program as announced Dec 20, 1968 (Press Release USDA 3054-69) changes in USDA's farm storage and drying equipment loan program based on a review of the expansion of on farm storage and drying capability. An adequate on farm storage and drying system, it was pointed out, should permit more orderly marketing of production and improved returns.

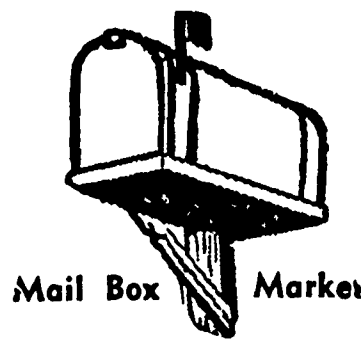
This program is one in which farmers can secure Commodity Credit Corporation loans for the purposes of constructing on-farm storage structures and purchase of drying facilities and certain handling equipment.

Following are the changes from the program as announced May 27, 1969.

Increase maximum amount for loans on dryers to 85 per cent of the net cost up to \$5,000 (compared to 65 per cent up to \$2,500 previously);

Increases storage structure needs to a farm's production for two years of eligible commodities (compared to one year previously);

Increases interest rate on loans to 6 1/2 cents per \$100 or fraction thereof per month or 7 1/2 per cent annual rate (compared to 50 cents or 6 per cent annual) and

## Local Ear Corn Prices Increase

Lancaster Farming's composite index of local grain prices shows ear corn prices increased more than five per cent in the past week (See page 3 for grain prices)

Bid price went from \$39.33 last week to \$41.67 this week and offered price climbed from \$42.67 to \$45.67

Albert Landis purchasing agent for Miller and Bushong, said he considers the higher price this week put prices 'about normal' for this time of year

He said prices had been temporarily depressed for the past two months or so because of a higher than usual influx into this area of corn from the West. The influx followed a jam up of rail shipments in December and January. The jam up seemed to break suddenly and resulted in a lot of corn here, according to Landis.

Now the situation is returning to normal and there should be "a continuing slight increase" in corn prices, Landis said.

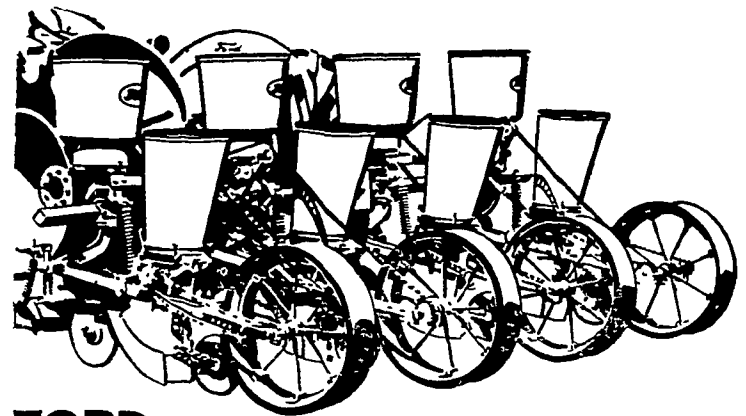
