Curtains For Less?

Check the dress goods counters for possibilities when you choose fabrics for curtains.

Dress fabrics are colorful and exciting in design and texture — and are usually available in varied widths and fabrics.

Cost per yard may be less than what you usually find in drapery fabrics.

Read the label before you make your decision. The label should list the fiber content along with directions for care. Be sure to note whether the fabric can be laundered or must be drycleaned — and check whether allowance must be made for shrinkage.

Tips On Working With Invisible Zippers

To make sure the fabric design will match after installing the invisible zipper, first stitch one side as usual on the right side of the fabric. Then close the zipper.

From the right side of the garment match the stripes or plaids — or waistline seam if there is one, and pin or tape the zipper in place.

Turn the garment to the wrong side and place the zipper face down on the seam allowance. With a pencil, mark across the zipper tape at each stripe, plaid or seam allowance, matching the marking on the tape with the design or seam to be matched.

Finish by stitching the seam below the zipper to complete the zipper application. Matching

plaids, stripes, or seam lines is a mark of quality in a garment.

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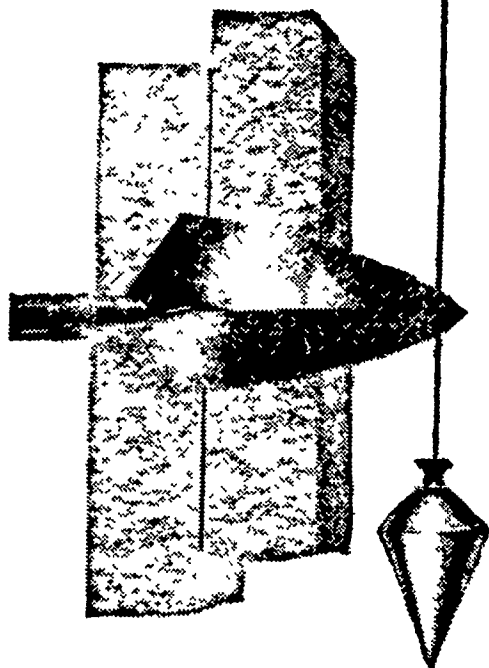
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
