

but glass making didn't really get started in this country until Stiegel in Manheim, Pennsylvania and Caspar Wistar in Salem County, New Jersey in the 1760's The first truly successful glass manufactory was the Boston Crown Glass Company which started up sometime after the Revolution

PRESSED AMERICAN machine built in 1837 by Demin Jarves and a resourceful carpenter They poured the molten metal into molds and pressed the glass into shape which greatly speeded up the work. Glass made by this process soon became beautiful and inexpensive and today most glass is made by some valiation of this process Pressed glass is quickly identified by lines caused by the parts of the mold The earlier types contained lead and are finer then most later types made with lime The glass itself may vary in texture but the overall shape of similar pieces is identical Bottles and insulators as well as decorative pieces must be included in this categoiv

ART GLASS includes fine cut glass and an endless alray of brilliantly colored, overlayed, iridesced, caived, fluted and other artistic workings Novelty and experimentation was the keynote The great art glass period started about 1880 and resulted in so many famous names and types of glass that no one, except perhaps the great Ruth Webb Lee, ever really approached a complete analysis of the field A few of the outstanding Art Glass types are Peachblow, Amberina, Aurene, Tiffany, Carnival, Quezal, Agate, Durand, Satın, Burmese and Pomona Many of the very finest pieces are one of a kind. Some are hand blown, some machine made, some a mixture of both
