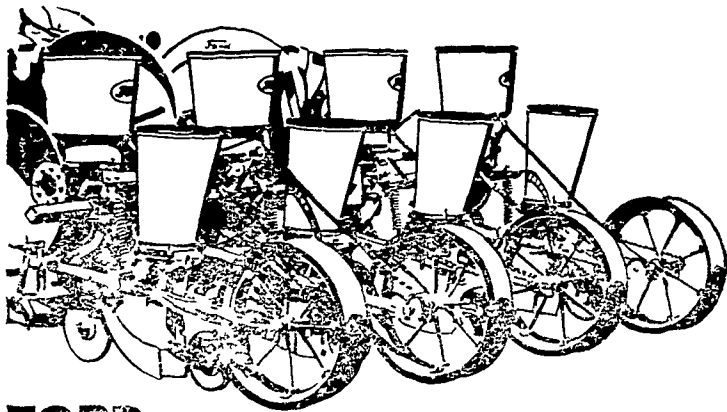

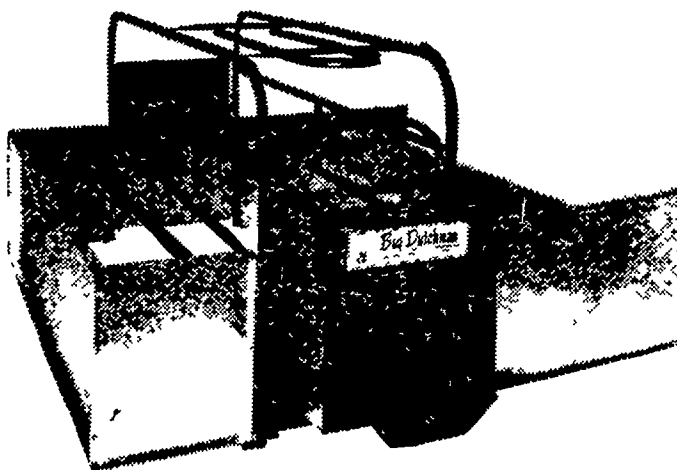
Miss Hess counted Lancaster County membership at 1010 farm women in 30 local societies.

The next County executive board meeting will be held at the Rhoads Spanish Tavern, Quarryville, on June 2 at 1:30 p.m.

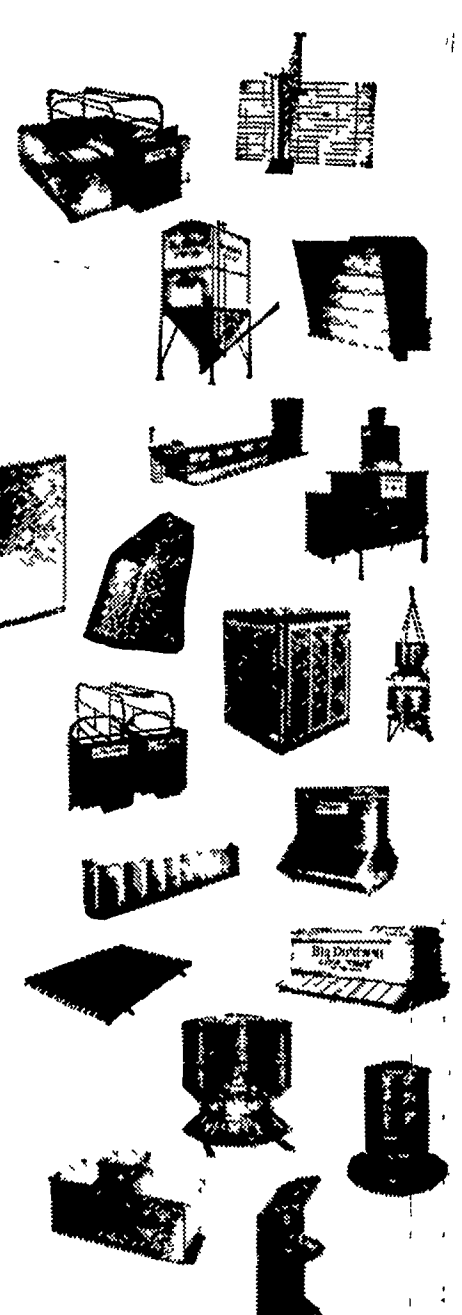
