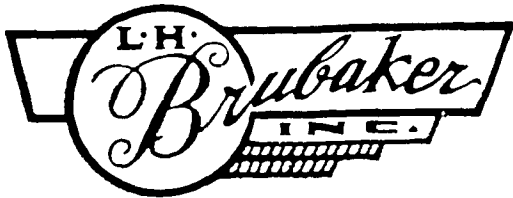
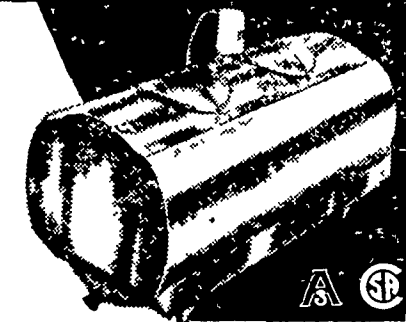

Entries are limited to members of the Women's Garden Club

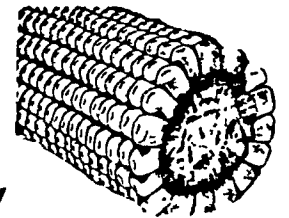
