Local floor stocks of mediums plentiful. Fancy large whites fully adequate with occasional distributors tending to be free sellers in an effort to stimulate movement. Light stocks of large browns clearing easily, jumbos short of full call, extra large about adequate. Cartoning activity slow to moderate with few feature ads at 49c for large

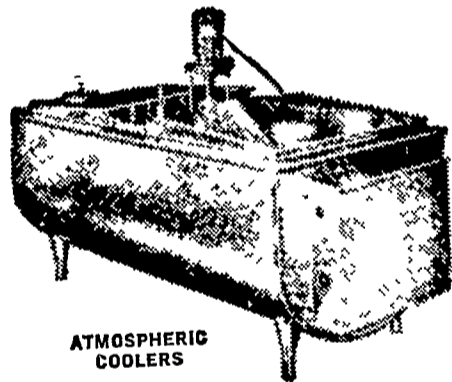
