Society of Farm Women 26 Manheim met recently at Emile's Handicraft Academy, Lancaster, for a question and answer program.

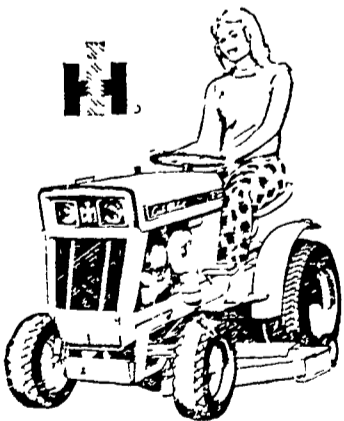

zen food while you're defrosting the freezer. First make sure the food is as cold as possible before you remove it. Then disconnect the freezer.

To keep food frozen while you are cleaning the freezer, wrap the food in blankets, several layers of newspaper, or other insulating material.

Use a thick flexible spatula-like tool to clean off the frost

Scrape the frost gently, but firmly. Be careful not to damage the freezer walls. Wash inside of freezer with a solution of one tablespoon of baking soda to one quart of water. Then rinse, wipe dry, and turn freezer on to its coldest setting. Replace the food when you see frost forming on the sides or in about ten minutes.

Remember to check if your freezer needs defrosting before you freeze a large quantity of meat, fruit or vegetables.
