Ready-to-cook movement spotty ranging fair to light and disappointing. Occasional product available at very competitive prices in some quarters. Less-than-trucklot prices lower on Plant Grade while unchanged to lower on U.S. Grade A. Advance business slow in developing with trading too limited to quote prices. Live supplies irregular ranging ample to in balance with needs. Undertone weak and unsettled.

Pool trucklot prices for Thursday arrival at terminal markets: U.S. Grade A 27-30c; Plant Grade 25½-27½ M 26½c. Special packs including 1¾-2, 3½ sizes few.

11 Drug Recalls Stem From Personnel Errors

Eleven case histories of the reasons behind drug recalls were recently issued by FDA to help illustrate the manufacturing problems that result from inadequately trained personnel.

FDA said that the agency's inspections and investigations reveal that firms encounter various problems because of inexperienced or inadequately trained personnel, and their actions or inactions often result in "serious manufacturing problems, some of which cause drug recalls."

"Since these problems extend throughout the manufacture, storage, and shipment of drugs," FDA continued, "it is necessary for drug firms to hire personnel with backgrounds of appropriate education or experience and to train personnel in specific job areas." The agency explained

"This issue of case studies focuses on situations involving poor manufacturing practices & errors which might have been eliminated through the use of adequately trained or experienced personnel. We hope they will be used as an educational tool and will encourage industry to initiate or improve its employee training program."

Prices generally unchanged. Undertone weak Demand slow on large whites and smaller sizes. Distributors tending to be free sellers and not refusing any reasonable offer. Numerous sales are at prices to be determined later. Inquiry is fair on extra large, jumbos and large browns. Receipts light. Floor stocks ample on large whites and smalls, excessive on mediums, adequate on extra large and standards. Very light on jumbos. Offerings heavy from the South and near by points. Less than fancy quality large clearing slowly and priced on the basis of standards. Sales of extra large ranged 38½-40½c mostly 39c. Caion orders disappointing with medium and large offerings ample. Loose pack country point offering freely available at 27c med, 24c sm, 15c Peewees.

Butter, Lard Use Down; Salad, Cooking Oils Up

Per capita consumption of food fats and oils at a record 51.8 pounds last year. USDA reported last week.

Mainly responsible for the increase increased per capita use of shortening and salad and cooking oils.

These more than offset decreased use of butter and lard. Margarine use remained at 10.8 pounds unchanged from a year earlier and more than double the 1947 total. Butter consumption at 5.4 pounds and lard use at 5.1 pounds were both at record lows.

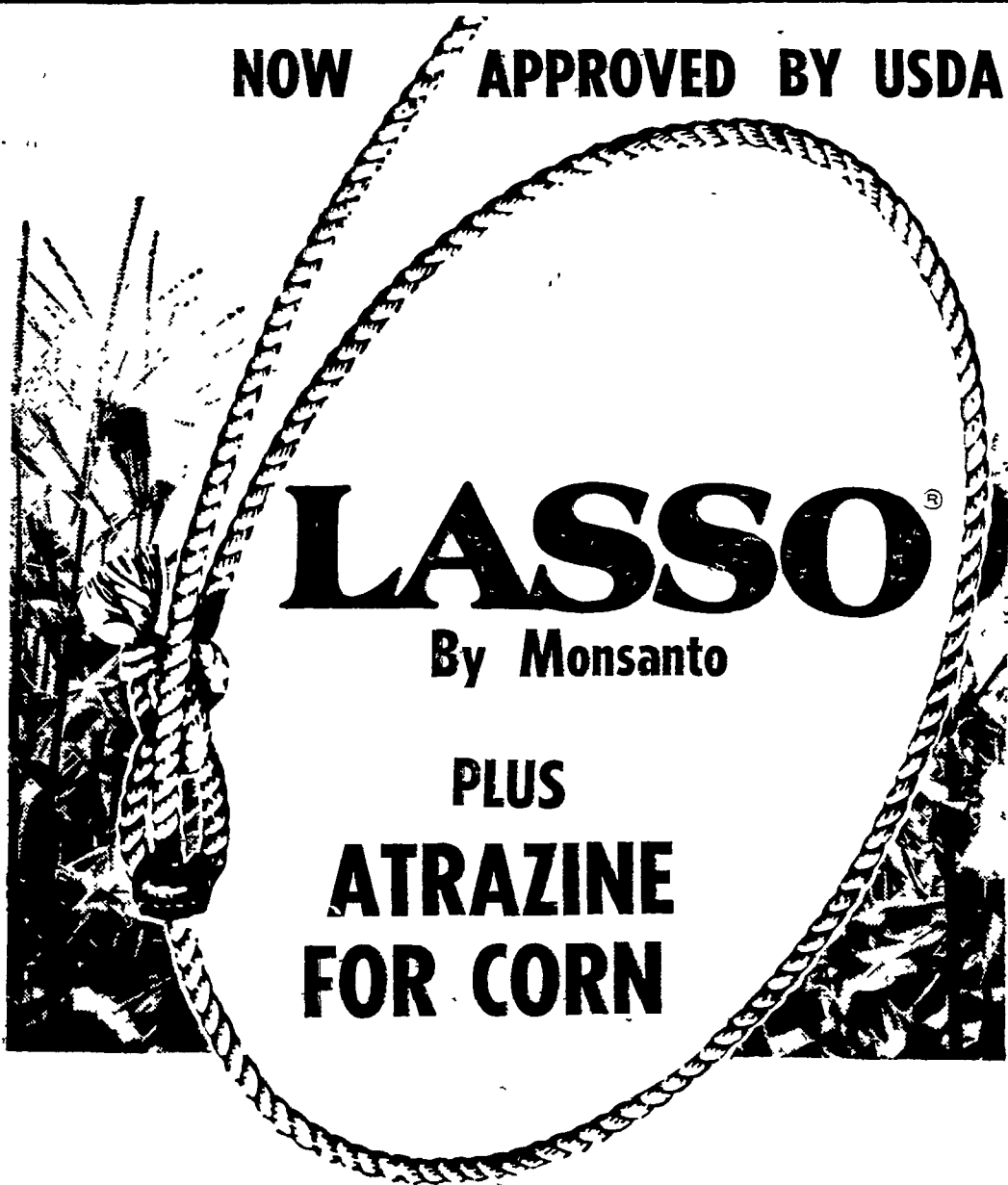

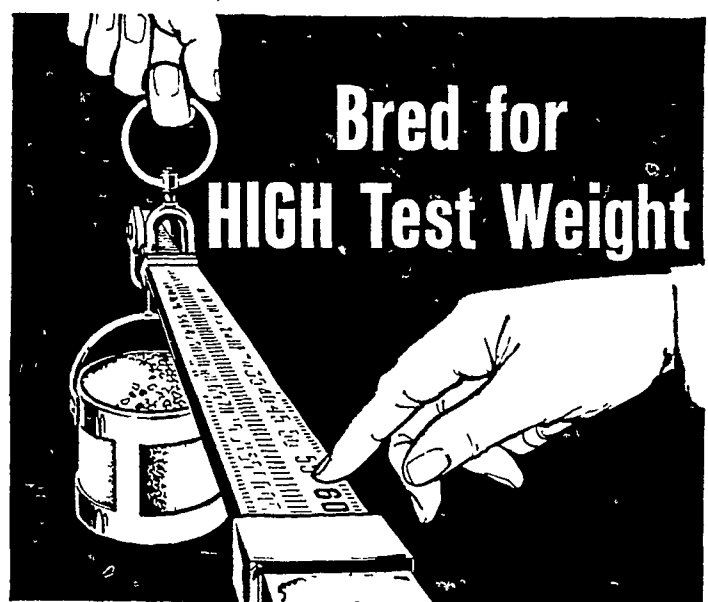
