Retained placenta - be sure that afterbirth is passed and if not, obtain your veterinarian's assistance Dairymen should not attempt to remove retained placenta This is a procedure which demands competent veferinaly assistance.

Pre-breeding examination have your veterinalian examine all animals sometime following the fust three weeks after calv ing

Record all heats and watch for abnormality — good breed ing iecoids are essential for diagnosis of abnormalities

Never bleed animals which show the slightest evidence of infection (abnormal discharge) Check especially at heat and following heat for abnormal dis charge.

Have all cows examined between 45 and 70 days follow ing last service Earlier examination is not recommended except for problem cows.




