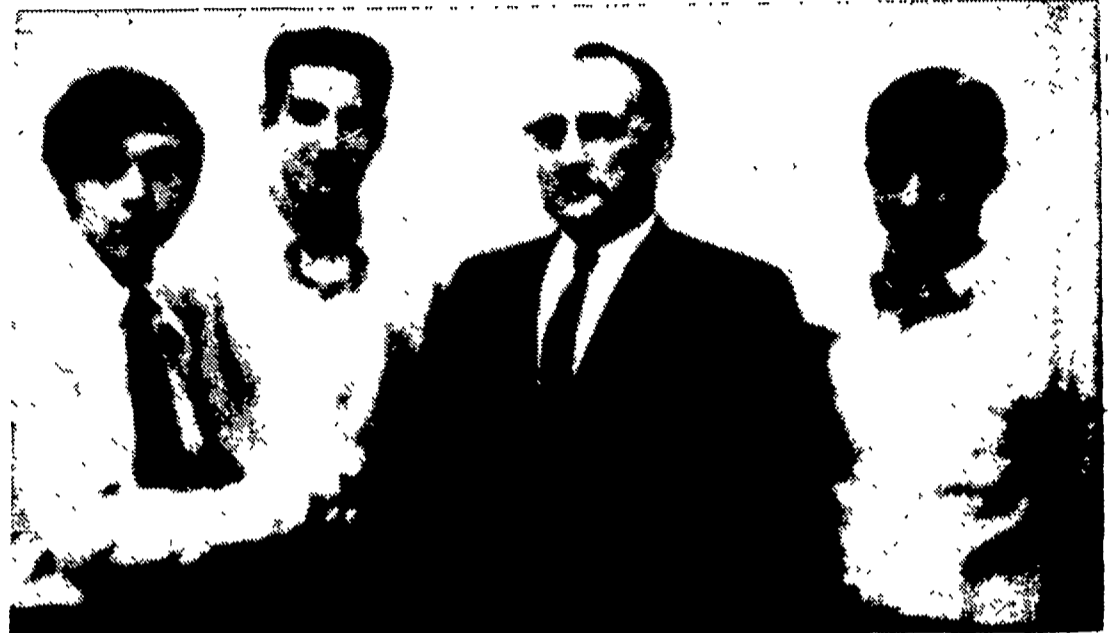
tend the University of Delaware to study home economics.

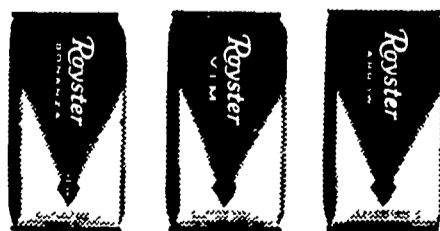
