





This goal was embodied in my Administration's efforts to properly fund the operations and improve conditions at our State institutions for the men tally ill and retarded

That goal also was embodied in Pennsylvania's unique Com munity Mental Health and Men tal Retardation Act of 1966

There is clear evidence avail able that shows these new efforts are having a positive effect For example, Pennsylvania is one of the few states that tial that all construction and all shows a dramatic decrease in the number of patients-10.000 since 1966 being admitted to mental health institutions

In the area of mental retardation, we have increased support for the institutions by 40 percent. This increase means that for the first time in history the level of support for the care of mentally retarded citi zens is equal to that available for the mentally ill.

But even with this dramatic progress, the problems we are er than the costs in State insti oncountering in providing qua- tutions. lity care for these citizens who must have our help are enormous.

That is why I appointed a Special Task Force more than six months ago to seek new approaches in the care and treatment of our mentally retarded Their recommendation a complete redirection of services for the mentally retarded during the 1970s

This, then, is what I propose The rapid development of a State-wide network of small. community - based residences, designed to meet the specific can cut through bureaucracy needs of the mentally retarded and red tape, and with the same whether they be severely multi- swift, courageous strokes we handicapped, those in need of can also cut through heartbreak long-term in-depth care of and despair


These community facilities will be developed through a State partnership with non governmental sources such as non-profit organizations church related groups, or private business Residential ser vices will be placed in their proper perspective — as only a part of a total continuum of care — rather than as an end in themselves

In every case it will be essenday-to-day care be carried out according to strictly designed and strictly enforced govern mental standards to insure quality care and proper use of our tax dollar

Preliminary studies indicate that the new plan not only car provide better care more quick ly than would be the case if the Commonwealth continues to 'go it alone," but that the cost per day can be the same or low


What we are proposing is in deed revolutionary, in that it has the capability of reducing the resident population at existing institutions, bringing residential care into the community where it belongs, coordina ting residential care with the full range of community services, and providing the entire program much faster and more economically than the State Government could do on its own.
