Scott Warns of Imports July

Pennsylvania's U.S. Senator August Hugh Scott recently warned the September Nixon Administration not to ignore "strong sentiment" to im- October pose important quotas on the entry of foreign articles into the November U.S. which would be damaging to the economy.

Republican Leader Scott, in a January '71 letter to Secretary of Commerce Maurice Stans, noted, "Unless February the Administration comes to grips with this import problem soon, the U.S may revert to a protectionist stance that is unparalleled in our history"

Scott reiterated. "I do not want c, see us become a dumping ground for foreign products at our own expense

Scott charged that Pennsylvania's economy had been huit and eggs are stronger. by the rising level of imports. He cited "the very serious situition" now confronting many Jomestic industries and mentioned textiles, shoes, steel and flat glass. Strong sentiment to impose import quotas "will not 30 away" and "will haunt every public official who advocates free trade at the expense of domestic industry," Scott said.
