Second to Agriculture**

More than 68 per cent of all fresh fruits and vegetables grown in the United States last year were hauled to market by trucks. What's more, some 97 per cent of frozen foods shipped 500 miles or less were shipped by trucks.

Ninety five per cent of all livestock and, overall, some 89 per cent of all agricultural products were carried from farm to initial markets by trucks according to American Trucking Association, Inc.

In all, the nearly 17 million for hire and private motor trucks registered in the U.S. last year traveled more miles (more than 200 billion), moved more tonnage (more than 35 billion tons) and paid more in federal and state highway "user" taxes (more than \$5 billion) than ever before.

Employment in the industry reached an all-time peak between nine and ten million jobs, depending on the source of the estimate. Salaries, too, remained

well ahead of the average for all private industry, nearing the \$10,000 mark on the average.

New truck registrations, some 17 million in 1967, had jumped again and are expected to double to 35 million per year by 1980.

As an industry, trucking was and is second in size in the nation only to agriculture.

Fertilizer Use Up

Consumption of fertilizer in the U.S. and Puerto Rico during the year ended June 30, 1969, placed at 38.9 million tons. That's up 1/2 of one per cent from a year earlier and 6/10 of one per cent more than indicated in the preliminary report issued last October.

While fertilizer use was up for the ninth consecutive year, the rate of increase was much below the 4 and 7 per cent increases recorded for the years ended June 30, 1967 and 1968, respectively, according to the USDA.
