Buying activity improving with the lighter offering of fancy eggs and fairly good interest evidenced on large and heavier sizes. Mediums continue in a long position despite the slightly improved demand while smalls are being closely cleared. Large browns in slow movement at present. Standards about adequate. Carton orders slow through small jobbers and just fan to large chain store distributors.

CATTLE — Compared last weeks close slaughter steers and Heifers 25-50 lower. Cows 50 to mostly 1 00 lower. Bulls steady.

Receipts near 80 percent slaughter steers 16 percent heifers, the balance mainly cows. Overall finish of slaughter steers much more attractive than last week with 25 percent.

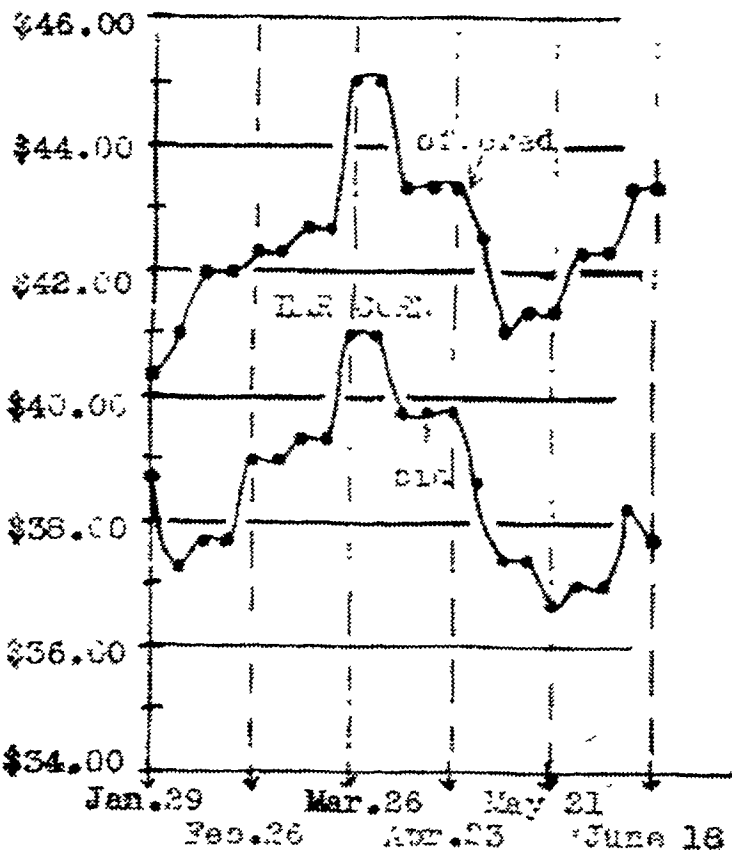
